WATT Samuel Beckett

A wide-eyed itinerant alights from a country train. The destination: Mr Knott's house. The mission: to serve.

Samuel Beckett's reputation as the twentieth century's preeminent chronicler of the human condition often obscures a position as one of the finest comic minds in literature. Here Beckett's wit and wisdom combine in the tale of a nomadic manservant never afforded a glimpse of their master.

Originally a novella written while Beckett was fleeing Nazis, *Watt* has been recast for the stage in a one-man production of lyrical elegance and heart-stirring immediacy.

It's a tour-de-force performance by Irish actor Barry McGovern, the foremost interpreter of Beckett's work in theatre today.
