
Teeth, Gums, Machines, Future, Society

Teeth, Gums, Machines, Future, Society is Reynaud-Dewar's film and expanded installation inspired by two very different sources: Donna Haraway's classic 1985 text A Cyborg Manifesto, and the gleaming 'grills' sported on the teeth of rappers.

From this curious interplay flows lines of enquiry that reach from aspirational hip-hop to the history of the slave trade, blurring the lines between a body's interior and exterior and the public and private self.

Complemented by a new live performance to premiere at MUMA and a separate lecture performance, Melbourne has a lot to wrap its gums around.

Exoplanets

New Zealand's Alicia Frankovich's works puncture the linearity of time, embodying the constant process of transformation that acts on all things.

Exoplanets is a choreographed exhibition in which Frankovich's videos, animations, sound and theatrical instruments constantly refigure themselves.

What might appear static springs to life, while the more conventionally animated finds itself interrupted or reframed. These metamorphoses may take ethereal form, as light or pure movement, but their impact is as real as the viewer's own body.
