Ronnie Van Hout

Celebrating the persona of the artist-as-outsider, Ronnie van Hout is best known for a distinctive brand of existential absurdism.

Referencing science fiction, cults, cinema, art history, popular and celebrity culture, van Hout draws upon childhood experiences and recollections to create wryly amusing yet heart-rending micro fictions.

This exhibition surveys 30 years of idiosyncratic sculpture, video, photography, embroidery and text that unleash deep social anxieties and feelings of self-consciousness, triggering the impulse to simultaneously laugh and cry. Van Hout's practice deliberately blurs the boundaries between self and other, artist and audience, tragedy and farce, at
