A NOTE ABOUT USING ISLE OF TUNE ON IPADS


The online website version of Isle of Tune is flash-based so it will not work on iPads.

However, there is a paid app that has been made especially for iPads and iPhones which has a few different features to the website version.

HOW TO CREATE MUSIC USING USING ISLE OF TUNE

1. Lay down some road



2. Add houses, plants or lamp posts along the road (there are extra options on the iPad app version)



- 3. Place a car on the road
- 4. Press Go. As the car drives past each element on the road it will make a rhythmic or melodic sound. At the end of the road, it turns around and plays your creation in retrograde :)




OTHER TIPS

 You can use pre-made loops: click on the Loops button and select a loop from the menu. Click in an empty space on the island (you'll see a preview of the loop size when you hover your mouse over the island) to add the loop to your composition. Place a car on the pre-made loop and click Go to hear it play




 Click on any of the sound-producing objects to change the pitch or playback sound





Click on any of the sound-producing objects to access rhythmic settings



- Scale settings: there are 5 different options which can be accessed by clicking on the **Tone** button (I think it would be better if it was named "Scale" instead of Tone!)
 - The Summer, Spring, Winter and Fall options are all variations on the pentatonic scale (for instance, Summer is the major pentatonic scale starting on doh, whereas Winter is the minor pentatonic scale
 - Access a full chromatic scale by clicking on the Keyboard Mode option



SAVING AND SHARING ON COMPUTERS

Although students are able to **Save** or **Share** their work in Isle of Tune there are some limitations you should be aware of before using Isle of Tune with your students:

About saving on computers (this does not apply to the iPad app version)

- **Saving** allows them to come back later on to continue working on their creation. HOWEVER the website saves the piece via the browser's cookies and there are limited saving "slots" (only 3)
- This means that if students are using their own laptops, saving in this way will probably be ok, as long as the student doesn't clear their browser history/cookies/cache between music classes
- I would not recommend relying on this saving method if your students are using shared computers in a school lab or from a cart. The main reason is that they would need to go back to the **exact** same computer in order to access their work and you would need to rely on the fact that no one had cleared the browser history between music classes (risky...!). If you are using shared computers, it would be best to use it for creative compositions that can be completed during one lesson

How to save

- Make sure you have named your Isle of Tune creation at the top of the screen
- Click on the Save/Load button





 Click on the save icon (floppy disk) next to an empty slot. Your song title should appear next to the icon

Loading a saved Isle of Tune creation

- Students need to go back to the computer they were working on, and open the Isle of Tune website
- Click on the Save/Load button and select the saved piece they would like to load

Sharing Isle of Tune creations (a note for teachers of students aged 12 and under)

- Once students have finished working on their Isle of Tune pieces, they can optionally share their
 work by clicking on the Share button and copying the link (which they can then save somewhere or
 send to their teacher)
- Sharing this way also makes their work public so it may not be suitable for those of you working with students who are aged 12 and under

SAVING AND SHARING ON IPADS

The iPad app version allows you to save many more Isle of Tune songs than the computer/desktop version (which is limited to 3).

- Tap the Tools button at top right to make the hidden menu items appear
- Tap the **Save** (or **Save As**) button
- Give your song a title and tap Save

Loading a saved Isle of Tune creation

- Students need to go back to the iPad they were working on, and open the Isle of Tune app
- Click on the Load button and select the saved piece they would like to load
