A few years ago I went to the Avalon Air Show in Victoria. It was a massive affair with acres of military equipment and planes and thousands of people, and it was awesome! What made it so good? Did I see every aircraft there that I wanted to? No. Did I enjoy the hefty entry fee and navigating through the hordes of people? No. Did I get a ride in a fighter jet, or even get to sit in one? No. Did I like being on my feet for hours on end in the hot sun? No.

So what made it so good? Let me tell you: I went with a great expectation that I was going to have an enjoyable day out. I was intent on getting the most out of the event and so didn't focus on the shortcomings of the experience. That same attitude, one of great expectation, has created many memorable experiences for me at places and events around this country and beyond, and also at home with family.

So why don't I always have that same great expectation when going to meet with my church family? You see, sometimes I focus on the faults rather than bringing an attitude of positive expectancy. Put another way, I focus on what I can get rather than what I can give. I might notice that the songs are not all to my taste, or that the Sabbath School teacher just read from the lesson book, or that so and so was playing on his phone the whole time, or that the preacher was hard to follow, or that you-know-who was cold to me in her reply or that the sermon went past 12pm!

I have a friend who gets so excited when the Sabbath comes around and eager for what she is going to get out of church. She drives to church thrilled that she is meeting with God, enthusiastic to praise Him, expectant that she will hear

something that will speak to her and a keenness to encourage, and be encouraged by the other members.

Perhaps my mindset needs a little tweaking. Perhaps my expectations need to be a little greater and a lot less self-focused. That way my church experience, my Big Camp experience and all other corporate worship opportunities will take on a new vibrancy. Like the Air Show, each one of these occasions can be a really enjoyable day out.

On the 18th of January this year our church mourned the loss of one of our very own in a tragic motor vehicle accident. Marcia Hremeviuc, 66, long time Alice Springs SDA Church member and

Australian aviation pioneer, was travelling with her partner John Morris, 73, who also was seriously injured. Both worked for the Department of Infrastructure and were on their way to Simpsons Gap to check the road conditions following the rains, as part of Mr Morris' role as an engineer. The accident also claimed the life of 17-year old boy.

Marcia did not leave any Next of Kin and considered the Alice Springs church and its members as her family. Our church family is poorer for the loss of Marcia's death, she is missed greatly, but we will remember her for the beautiful and gentle person that she was.









# Primary – Miracles of Jesus
