The 2019 year is off and racing and one month has whizzed by already! A question for you. In all the resolutions for 2019 and/or plans you've made for the year, did they include any for mission and/or service? How are you going to be "Driven by Mission" this year? There is still time to make an amendment!

We have reduced our contingent of staff in the Office this year, with Gration Perera leaving and Charlene Luzuk's role reduced to 10%. It has been good to welcome Elizabeth Suavai and Errol Ope who replace staff, and Sarah Tekopua part-time. All up, a reduction of approximately 1.3 FTE in the Office. Some of the team are working on year-end financials, with our first lot of auditors arriving late February, while others are working on the details for upcoming events (Big Camp, Youth programs, Board Meetings etc). We hope that you are making plans to come to Big Camp this year - save the date - 28 June to 6 July 2019.

MEMBERSHIP

Our total membership was 2,742 as at 31 December 2018 (2,699 at 31 December 2017). The 2018 year saw 48 Baptisms (up from the 45 in 2017 and 75 in 2016) and fifteen Professions of Faith across the Conference (up from six in 2017).

TITHE

Tithe is the means by which we employ pastors, plant new churches, and continue sharing the gospel in our communities. Thank you for being faithful in returning your tithes and offerings during 2018, and as you continue in 2019. Total tithe received during 2018 was \$3,644,516.51 (\$273,393.95 higher than 2017). We praise God as this increase has helped us to meet our expenses in 2018 and cover some of the deficits from prior years. The graph below shows the upward trend in tithe received over the last 10 years.

I was recently chatting to a few of our volunteers in an ADRA Op Shop over lunch. One of the volunteers was a lady in her 60's who had shared with me about how she has worked for various Op Shops over the past 20 years, and has now been at the ADRA Op Shop for 7 years. I had one question burning inside of me that I wanted to ask her, and I admit that I was hoping for a specific answer. "Is there something that is unique about your experience and time here at the ADRA Op Shop that sets ADRA apart from the other op shops?"

She stopped for a moment, clearly never having thought about it before, and I watched her brain tick over. Then suddenly her face lit up as she clearly found an answer that resonated deep in her heart; "Yes there is actually!" Even before she started to answer I saw her eyes start to water and she smiled softly, looking down at her hands. "I belong here. They have become my family. I used to be lonely which is strange because I'm a very social person. I'm happy; we just care about each other."

When I am here with the other volunteers.

Then the three ladies started talking about an older man who recently died and how much they missed him and his quirky ways. They giggled when one of them joked that she thought that he never actually did any work but just walked around talking to people and cheering them up! Before long they were all teary and laughing out loud, just basking in the memories of their friend who had gone too soon.

This is what ADRA Op Shops are about. A place where people connect and belong. A place where the volunteers are driven to serve by their own sense of belonging, who serve customers with their hearts, not only with their hands. Where their care for each other flows over into care for those who enter their store. More than once I have heard volunteers say that their favourite thing about being an ADRA volunteer is seeing someone come into the store looking flat or down, but walk out a few minutes later with a smile across their face! I want to take this moment to honour our ADRA volunteers. for the impact that they have on the lives of hundreds of people who are often in vulnerable situations. Thankyou.

TOWNSVILLE AND NO FLOODING

In response to the overwhelming flooding in Townsville and surrounding areas in February, ADRA offered churches in affected areas up to \$2,000 each to use for assisting community members. This is a vital opportunity for church members to actively reach out and make a difference at a time where people are most vulnerable. And this is exactly what a large group of church members from Aitkenvale, Townsville City and Ayr churches did - they combined forces to fill, deliver and lay sandbags, to purchase bulk food items and deliver to help feed SES workers and go house to house to check up on people.

Nathan Bourke, the response coordinator shared that it was so great to see the difference that just a few people can make, filling in the gaps and needs to support the flood response. People were asking what ADRA is and it was an opportunity to share that we are volunteers from local churches, and that ADRA is a humanitarian organisation that not only responds to disasters, but







FLY AND BUILD - MYANMAR



"Why Myanmar", you may ask? It is one of the countries where the need is greatest. With approximately 54 million population, this Buddhist country has an Adventist membership of around 50,000.

All of their fields are organised as missions, including their Union. That means that they are not financially selfsufficient.

Five years ago, while doing a "Fly & Build" project to Mountain View Adventist Academy in Taungngu, Central Myanmar, Pr Marcus visited the team. He spoke with Pr Wolfgang about coming to help him with his church in Theinlar Village near Myaungmya, about a day's journey by car. The pictures he brought showed a very large hole too close to the church building, which had been washed out over 20 years by the massive monsoon rains with 2500mm rainfall per year.

Brother Tom Gigliotti, (the builder) with 10 other volunteers, almost all of them from the Atherton Tablelands in the NAC, and 2 from Germany, started the Project on Jan 7 and finished Jan 18. In order to fill in this massive hole, they constructed 3 retaining walls with reinforced concrete fenceposts, cyclone wire and shadecloth. After the first wall was erected, dozens of trucks brought dirt, a total of 600 m3 and tipped it close to the hole.

The team were so thankful that 10 - 25 students from Myaungmya college (MUAS) and the Academy (AYAS) were able to assist. Without their help the project could not have been completed.

In the evenings, Pr & Mrs Wolfgang conducted an evangelistic campaign which saw the church packed on an almost nightly basis. Again many students supported it with musical items as well as with their attendance. The meetings culminated with the baptism of 14 precious people on Sabbath, Jan 19.

May all thanks and praise go to God for granting good health and strength to all the team, as well as His enabling Grace.
