

A FRESH LOOK AT CHURCH

In the few decades I have been a Seventh-day Adventist Christian, some things have changed in the way we do church. Women used to all wear hats, a lot more was happening evangelistically and involving everyone, all the men wore suits, the overhead projector was bringing variety you didn't see outside of a mission program, Sabbath was an all day affair with AY's in the afternoon and a social event in the evening, and church camps and outings were a regular occurrence.

If you look at changes in church over a longer period of 150 years, you see some more dramatic variation. There was only Sabbath School and the Social Meeting on Sabbath morning - no church service (unless an evangelist or church leader was travelling through and addressed the saints). There were no pastors caring for churches. The churches cared for themselves using the local leadership structure while the pastors opened up interests in previously unentered territory. The church was a movement, growing at a rapid pace and having to continually adapt its structures to cope with the constantly expanding work. Mission was something members involved themselves with, and gave liberally to, rather than being the work of the pastor or evangelist.

But to see even more dramatic changes, we need to go back many centuries to when the early Christian church was starting. There were no church buildings and no clergy (these didn't appear until the fourth century). All church, ministry and evangelism happened in homes in the community, led by ordinary families. Males and females were equally involved in using the gifts of the Spirit and passing faith on to their children. Massive amounts of personal resources were committed to the work of ministering to needs in the community. Corporate worship and praise was a daily activity.

The contrast is quite stark as we see what a difference two thousand years can make to the way church happens. Perhaps the best way to describe the difference is that the early church was missional (out in the community for the purposes of growing the church with disciple making disciples) versus attractional (all ministry happens in or from a church building, pastor expected to preach and visit members regularly, entertainment rather than service based), which is the church model we operate with today.

So you might notice that things have changed a bit from where Christianity started to today. We have inherited lots of tradition and culture over the years, and the centuries. That is why the Roadshow, with guest presenter Pr Peter Roennfeldt, has been so refreshing. Through teaching and modelling simple early Christian practices such as Agape meals, Bible reading, conversational prayer, anointing and a reliance on the daily filling of the Holy Spirit, we catch a glimpse into daily Christian life shortly after Jesus returned to heaven. It's exciting and empowering realise that every believer can take up the tools of discipleship and step out into the community with some wonderful ways of blessing people and bringing eternal change to their lives. What if as a Conference we embraced our missional roots and became a movement again? I believe that would put us in the centre of God's will for the NAC, and make an incredible difference for the Kingdom in our communities!

We are ramping up towards year end (for those that may not be aware we operate on a calendar, not a financial, year). "Staffing season" is well underway and planning for 2020.



BREATHE FREE 2

Cairns church Personal Ministries held it's first evidence based cessation smoking program—BreatheFree2. Currently BreatheFree2 is a joint project between the International Commission for the Prevention of Alcohol and Drug Dependency and the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, with support from Loma Linda University School of Public Health. It's an update of the 30 year old stop smoking program. Thanks to Dr. Ike, Micheal & Denise Hansell and Robbie Ford for their support. Not forgetting the prayers of our church family. One participant saw the advertisement on the church board and walked in. One stopped smoking from being a 30 per day cigarette smoker, and others cut back drastically. Prayers were offered with and for the participants before and after the program. And prayers are continuing. The participants were provided workbooks and additional information to break the habit completely. Participants are engaged in ongoing bible studies and commitment to attending church on sabbath. BAPTISM



Lyn Joy and Pr Wolfgang are currently in the Philippines, where they are conducting different evangelistic campaigns.

Their latest campaign has just concluded in Valencia on the Island of Bohol. The island itself boasts some of the most beautiful scenery/beaches in the Philippines. Its 1.3 million population enjoys a mostly rural lifestyle.

The religion here is strongly Roman Catholic. When they see that Adventists conduct a campaign, they watch and take note of the homes that show an interest. Before our mass baptism, men on motorbikes visit the same homes and warn the people not to get baptized. They try to intimidate them.

At a recent evangelistic campaign between 20 - 30 people decided to get baptized. But on the Sabbath of the baptism, not one of them turned up.

In the most recent campaign, an 81 year old lady was thrilled at the messages she heard. She confessed she had never heard such things before, about the love of God, about healthy living, about the 3 Angels Messages etc. She decided to get baptized. Consequently she received a visit from a man on a motorbike. He told her not to get baptized, or she will have her name removed from the church role. She told him, "just remove my name, because I have made up my mind."

This lady was one of 24 precious souls who gave their hearts to the Lord and joined the Seventh-day Adventist Church through baptism.

Praise the Lord that the Lord still has people out there that need to be harvested into His remnant church.

By doing things together like fishing, servicing a car, going camping, playing basketball or whatever it may be, you create common ground and positive memories. Mackay Central took a group of boys camping at Eungella, Fairleigh organised activities, Edmonton and Cairns teamed up to go camping and fishing on Russell Island and the Great Barrier Reef, Aitkenvale spent the morning fishing (and cooking the fish on the beach for morning tea!). All in all positive memories were established and good times were shared. Mentoring doesn't have to be limited to a program or an event. Anyone can use their vocation/talents to mentor. Are you a tradie? Take a teen on the job for some experience. Are you a musician? Offer lessons to the younger generation. Are you in the army? Teach teens the art of bush survival. 


