

RECORD BOOKS

On Thursday, October 10, I made my way into the Guinness Book of World Records. While that sounds like an impressive feat on my part, it actually took an additional 2,498 people to make the attempt successful. That date was World Mental Health Day, and Townsville decided to spotlight the issue by going for a World Record for the "most people wearing high-visibility vests at a single venue." So there at Bunnings in Fairfield (which had been flooded out in February along with much of Townsville) we gathered to beat the previous record set in Japan. You can imagine the response when the Guinness Book of Records man in his American accent announced that we had set a new World Record with a total of 2,499 people.



But that's not the most significant record to be broken around that time. Less than two weeks before, the final meeting of our Personal Ministries Roadshow came to an end in Alice Springs, and when the numbers were tallied up 80% of our attending membership (1,049) had participated around the Conference! I think that is an incredible number, and far more noteworthy than a bunch of people in hi-vis vests. Why? Because the Roadshow meetings were making a difference for the Kingdom and four out of five people in our Conference attended!

There were a number of Kingdom building concepts that Pr Peter Roennfeldt shared in his presentations which will make a huge impact if applied: complete reliance on the Holy Spirit to empower and equip for mission, Agape meals, Ethne (the people around you) mapping, Discovery Bible Reading, conversational prayer, anointing. It should come as no surprise to find that these were key practices of the New Testament church and they experienced incredible vitality and significant growth as a result.

So our challenge now is whether we will move from being hearers of the word to doers (James 1:22) in regards to these practices. It's more comfortable to continue on as we are, but the reality is that we will continue to experience the same lacklustre results by doing what we have always done. We have the opportunity to embrace the same exciting practices that church members in the first century were using but, above all, we get to partner with the Holy Spirit and watch Him open the way before us, and we get to operate in the centre of God's will for us (to be a disciple and go and make other disciples).

Creating World Records is fun. Creating Conference Records is even better. But my aim is to create an Eternal Record by getting my name and many others in the Record Book in Heaven. That's where it really counts. How about you?

I've just returned from visiting **all of our Schools,** where work is continuing on strategic site development master plans to plan for not only future buildings, but also green space and play space. Our schools are developing rolling school improvement plans, introduced by our Education Director, Jack Ryan, to focus on all aspects of school operations. We serve a God of excellence and order and want to plan for sustainable growth across our Education system. It has been exciting hearing from the communities and now as the plans are being refined to hear clarity being sought about what our points of difference from other schools are.



BOWEN OUTREACH

Bowen is a small, coastal town approximately 200 kilometres south of Townsville. Two women from the local SDA church were available to accompany Willa, at separate times, during the first two days. It was during these days of door knocking that Willa had the privilege of talking with and then leading a lady to the Lord. She also made contact with a retired couple who were very interested in her canvass and bought quite a few books. The man had been learning the guitar and was keen to receive a few lessons from Willa who then used the next three afternoons to return to their home for an hour to teach him both the ukulele and the guitar. I accompanied Willa on one of those teaching occasions and chatted to his wife. It was such a blessing to have them come and worship with us on the following Sabbath and to thoroughly enjoy the fellowship lunch.

After prayer, we decided that Thursday and Friday would be spent in an area near where we were staying. This was definitely the Lord's direction because the people we made contact with were so open to hearing our message. There was a young man who Willa spoke to who was amazed to learn about the Sabbath and also that Revelation was a book which could be understood. He said he was thinking of changing from the Baptist church and although he wouldn't take any Adventist material, he said he would definitely start studying his Bible carefully for the truth in it. While this conversation was in progress, Gillian 'happened' to be talking to his friend in another house around the corner who took a booklet on the state of the dead! During the last couple of hours of Thursday afternoon, Willa and Gillian worked together and spoke to two ladies who were Baptist church members. They were enthralled with the health message, and the Sabbath truth, and were excited that the pastor would visit them to begin Bible studies. Throughout this conversation, one of the ladies jumped up excitedly, ran inside, and began bringing out unopened piles of dusty books. They were the Encyclopaedia of Foods, the large format Spirit of Prophecy books and two bundles of Bible Stories for Children. She said she'd paid them off gradually a long time ago and had totally forgotten about them!

To sum up the week, the Lord's Holy Spirit was definitely working on the hearts of many people in Bowen as He led us to those who needed prayer, encouragement and Truth. We sold books, gave out books and made contact with about half a dozen non attending Adventists. Thanks to Bowen church for inviting us, to Naomi for opening her home to us and welcoming us as her guests and to the church members who came on doors with us and who prayed for the outreach.

SABBATH SCHOOL AND STEWARDSHIP REVIVED

The Cairns region were extremely blessed over four consecutive nights, with powerful and inspiring presentations by Dr Erika Puni who spoke about how to revive our Sabbath School time stressing the importance of personal Bible study and how to be faithful in Stewardship. Dr Puni outlined four Bible study principles for lesson preparation:

- 1. Observation: identify key words, concepts/themes, repetitions
- 2. Exposition: looking for "meaning"
- 3. Application: applying the message to self, first, and in these times
- 4. Presentation: sharing and delivering for benefit of others

Dr Puni also outlined seven habits of a highly effective Bible student:

- 1. Think for ones-self (not just a reflector of another man's thoughts)
- 2. Make time for in-depth Bible study (be intentional to make time)
- 3. Allow the biblical context to rule (Exegesis)
- 4. Seek to understand the big picture (Meta Narrative or Major Themes)
- 5. Listen to God's voice in the text
- 6. Keep pace with Gods present truth (truth is dynamic)
- 7. Make personal application

With Stewardship Dr Puni outlined four main passages concerning Tithe and Offering that all Adventist should know:

- 1. Leviticus 22 offering
- 2. Leviticus 27:30-33 tithe: a specific quantity of the whole
- 3. 2 Corinthians 8
- 4. 2 Corinthians 9

"Stewardship is the response of our salvation" therefore "Stewardship is a privilege not a burden" was what Dr Puni shared.


