








HOT DOG PRAISE

A pastor was sharing a story of a memorable baptism he once conducted. It was with a man who had no church exposure before meeting Jesus. Enthusiastically he embraced his new found faith and heartily committed to everything he discovered in the Bible. On the day of his baptism he was lowered into the water and raised to walk in the newness of life. He came up out of the water clapping his hands and shouting, "Hot dog, hot dog, hot dog." The congregation tried to stifle their laughter. The pastor quickly asked them for silence as he explained that this man had not been around the church much and didn't know about "Amen, Praise the Lord, and Hallelujah;" his word was "Hot dog," and he was praising the Lord with the only vocabulary he knew.

It's good to praise God, and I know He accepts the shout of "hot dog" from a grateful heart as readily as an "Amen" or a "Hallelujah." As I reflect on 2019, I can see God's hand at work across our Conference, and in my family and personal life. I am incredibly grateful for His providence and many remarkable answers to prayer, and answers to things I hadn't prayed about. Here's some NAC praise points from last year:

- 1. Budget after tracking well behind for most of the year, tithe income slightly exceeded budget for the year, plus we received an additional one-off tithe payment of \$100,000. Praise God for your faithfulness.
- 2. Staffing having to replace a Youth Director, senior accountant, T&O support person, school principal and find four new teachers and a chaplain is no easy task. Plus we had two people step up to be volunteer departmental leaders. Praise God for the quality people that He impressed to fill these vacancies.

- Grants while our operating budget remains very tight, we secured a lot of funding for different projects. The largest was \$403,000 Safer Communities funding for security, fencing and lighting around the Riverside Estate. Federal government also provided \$20,000 to Riverside school for fencing and the AUC provided \$71,250 to Riverside Convention Centre for electrical fit out for powered sites relocation. The SPD gave us \$30,000 to assist Literature Evangelists and churches working closer together. A generous donor also gave \$45,000 to add to the Camp Special Projects offering to employ Marty and Michelle in Tennant Creek for another year. Praise God for moving governments, church administrations and individuals to look favourably on the needs of our Conference.
- Roadshow having 80% of our attending members come to the Roadshow presentations with Pr Peter Roennfeldt was a real thrill. Praise God that you made this a priority as the Personal Ministries Roadshow seeks to inspire and equip for disciple making.

I just want to praise God for His generous provision to our Conference in so many ways. I can also praise him for our schools and staff, our pastors, office workers and camp ground managers. I can praise Him for our dedicated members who faithfully serve in so many ways. While there are so many blessings to praise God for, there are an equal number of ways to actually praise Him. "Hot dog" is one way! What's your way to express your gratitude to God for all He has done this past year?

Hi everyone,

Stewardship is about **God First** - in **time**, **talents and treasures**. Thank you for serving Him in 2019 and I'm looking forward to the 2020 journey.

God really blessed our Conference in 2019! We have a great team across all our entities and it has been inspiring hearing stories of how God has touched people's lives during 2019.

Staffing - our pastoral team hasn't seen any changes to staff or locations for 2020, however, you will have read elsewhere in this edition that we have changes in our Departmental team, including the introduction of some more volunteers to assist local churches. Our school teams have welcomed a new Principal at Riverside, along with new teaching staff and support staff across all segments.

Our Conference wide **Special Projects Offering 2019**, which was launched at Big Camp, for **Tennant Creek Bible Workers** raised \$26,160 (as at 31/12/2019), with pledges still being received into 2020. The cost of having Bible Workers there is approximately \$65,000 a year. We were blessed with some private sponsorship and continue to look for ways to fund this ministry in 2021.

Pastor Don Fehlberg sent a report that there were 17 students in the Graduation Block at Mamarapha College from the NT, and 2 baptisms of NT folk who were the first in their communities to be baptised. The work of our Central Australian pastoral team is invaluable to sharing the gospel.

School Awards Nights are always a high day in our school communities, celebrating with staff, students and their families and friends. It was a great privilege to attend Carlisle Adventist Christian College's Awards Night in December and recognise the first Year 12 graduating class! Congratulations again students and community! Did you know that our secondary teachers at Carlisle had an extra big year in 2019? - they have had to transition from OP to ATAR which involved not only learning a new curriculum but teaching both streams!

The agreement for **Education Director Services** through South Queensland Conference is continuing to **strengthen our school system**. Jack Ryan and his team are providing invaluable support.

If you pop past the Conference Office you will see that the signage for the **Adventist Book Centre** has been updated and increased to assist people to locate it. A small investment that has already been noticed by some of our neighbours.

Our **finance team** are focused on finalising budgets, year-end transactions and preparing for visits by the audit teams.

STATISTICS

Our Conference **Membership** was 2,735 as at 31 December 2019 (down from 2,742 at 31 December 2018).

The 2019 year saw membership growth through 24 Baptisms, 8 Professions of Faith, and 24 Letters.

Sadly we also had a number of folk pass away or leave our church during 2019.

Tithe to 31 December 2019 was \$3,665,738, a 0.6% increase on the prior year.

THE ADRA CORNER





Here is another update about how your support has enabled ADRA to help those affected by the devastating bushfires. Below are just a few examples. A lot more is happening all around the country.

Albury Adventist Church members, with ADRA's help, coordinated the purchase and delivery of food and supplies to the Country Fire Association (CFA) volunteers in Burrowye for four days.

Families in Clifton Creek, Gelantiply, Buchan, Sarsfield, and Club Terrace have also received essentials such as water, groceries, hygiene packs, cleaning materials, solar energisers, steel posts, wire, insulators, generators and requested furniture.

In Victoria, volunteers sourced fencing to help emergency services contain freely roaming livestock. Access was also given to Cann River, where eggs, bread, meat, fruit, vegetables and generators were delivered. Volunteers in Sarsfield will attend a community meeting with other agencies to determine the next steps in the recovery process.

27 generators were delivered to Kangaroo Island in South Australia where ADRA worked alongside Island Care and the Australian Defence Force to distribute the generators to those needing it most. Copeville and Riverland church members delivered 30 round bales of hay to farmers in need of food for their stock.

The recovery effort is underway in Woodside, South Australia. On one property, teams from Flight Centre and ADRA helped pulled out burnt water lines and lay new ones as well as cutting off fire-damaged fruit to help the vines have the best chance of survival. More teams are heading out every week.

Thankyou for your continued support and prayers for those affected by fires, and for the on-going bushfire response.

MEALTIME ON MILTON

Mealtime on Milton Community Dinner kicks off for its third year this year, continuing to serve the community in Mackay. Last year saw the addition of free hair cuts by Hair Aid Australia on six weekly basis, in addition to Orange Sky Laundry. The final dinner for 2019, was Christmas themed and saw over 70 community members attend and enjoy a delicious Christmas feast. We have been very blessed with regular attendance from community members, and all those involved have enjoyed making a difference in the community. Mealtime on Milton for 2019 served 909 meals to members of the community throughout the year and approximately 700 takeaway meals were sent home with attendees. We are eternally grateful for the volunteers from our church community, and also for members from the community who volunteer with us. This year has found the efforts of all being recognised locally with a nomination for an Australia Day Award. We're looking forward to see where the Lord blesses and leads this year.





In October 2019 the Complete Health Improvement Program (CHIP) was introduced in Alice Springs and the response from the community has been excellent. The venue was donated by a community member (non Adventist) who has been one of the enthusiastic participants. A series of sessions were held - two sessions every week until Sunday, December 1, 2019. The series of CHIP sessions will resume on Sunday, February 9, 2020, and will run for four weeks, at the end of which there will be a graduation ceremony. The volunteers and participants have put in a lot of time and effort and are looking forward to the completion of the program. It was during one of the CHIP promotional sessions held at the town's Multicultural Centre that a community member offered the venue for this program. Attendances have been averaging eighteen participants and there are others interested in joining the second round of CHIP sessions when they commence later in March 2020. By the grace God, Alice Springs hope to run CHIP program four times this year and it will be a blessing to see more local church members being certified as CHIP Facilitators.
