MINITORIAL

Many terrible atrocities have been committed in the name of religion, but one notable event had eternal ramifications and spurned a movement with billions of followers. As I have reread the crucifixion and resurrection stories in the Gospels this week, something stood out in Matthew's account. Pilate, realising Jesus is innocent, tries to lead the unruly crowd to a plan B. One Bible translation poses his solution this way: "Whom do you want me to release for you, Jesus Barabbas or Jesus who is called Christ?" (Matt 27:17 NET). Depicted as having the same name, the contrast couldn't be starker. And the question is still relevant to you and me today - will we choose Jesus Christ, or an alternative god of our own making? Astoundingly the religious leaders stirred up the crowd to choose Jesus Barabbas, and they went so far in their convictions as to fully accept the damning consequences, "Let his blood be on us and on our children" (v.25).

This Easter weekend, I again choose Jesus Christ. How could I not after His limitless love for me took Him to a torturous death for my sins. I have chased many other gods over the years but they have brought no happiness or contentment in much the same way as the insurrectionist and murderer Barabbas couldn't do for that rabble what Jesus Christ could. The decision of that crowd outside Pilate's palace 2000 years ago is an absolute tragedy. They chose the wrong Jesus.

With most of the usual distractions removed, thanks to the Coronavirus, I encourage you on this Easter weekend to refresh yourselves with the closing scenes of the life of Jesus who is called Christ. It will prove a blessing to you as the words of this lovely hymn (290) poignantly describe:

His word shall not fail you He promised; Believe Him and all will be well: Then go to a world that is dying, His perfect salvation to tell!

Turn your eyes upon Jesus, Look full in His wonderful face; And the things of earth will grow strangely dim In the light of His glory and grace.
