IN HIS TIME

At the time of writing this, our son, Raygio, is on the plane to Vanuatu for a mission trip with his school, Tweed Valley Adventist College (TVAC). I would like to share how God answered our prayer.

In preparation for this mission trip, my wife, Cathy, submitted the visa application with all the other necessary documents on September 26 to the Vanuatu High Commission (VHC) in Canberra, where they sent the documents to the Immigration office in Port Vila, Vanuatu. We thought it would be an easy, straightforward process and that we would get the visa in no time but it turned out that Cathy had to make many phone calls and send many emails to VHC to check and enquire about the visa situation. We had been praying and praying and praying and it seemed that every time Cathy made a phone call, there would be no progress. We started to feel anxious and frustrated with how they were handling the application.

A day before the scheduled departure, Monday (November 7), Cathy made the last attempts to call and find out the status of Raygio's visa. The officer for consulate services asked Cathy to resend all the documents again because the network was down. He said he would send them to his colleague in the Immigration office in Vanuatu and he would try to get the visa letter before the office closed at 4:30pm. Meanwhile, the school Coordinator for this trip, who had already arrived in Vanuatu, also went to the Immigration office in Port Vila to hand in the printed copies of all the documents to the officer there and left because they didn't know what else to do, since all the systems were down.

At that time, there was nothing else we could do, it was beyond our control and we could only place it in God's control, in His gracious and merciful hands. I prayed with Cathy and Raygio in the afternoon to surrender everything to the Lord. During that time, I was told that Paul Fua, principal of TVAC, sent an email to all the teachers, staff and students, to make it an urgent matter to PRAY for Raygio's visa.

Around 4:00pm, Cathy earnestly prayed and made the last calls 10 minutes before 5:00pm with no reply. After she attempted about 11 calls with no reply, she finally gave up. It was 5:09pm and the Immigration office in Vanuatu was already long closed. So she just surrendered all to God's will, believing that He would do what was best for Raygio.

As she prayed, she was holding her Bible and then suddenly a page in the Bible was opened, and there was a highlighted verse that drew her attention. It was Mark 10:27 "But Jesus looked at them and said, "With men it is impossible, but not with God: for with God all things are possible." At that moment, Cathy knew that God would work things out somehow and then an email came stating, "visa for Raygio."

What a precious lesson, that God is always faithful and good. Sometimes, God allows things to not go according to plan until the last minute to try our faith. Let us move forward in faith because God will make things beautiful in His time.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

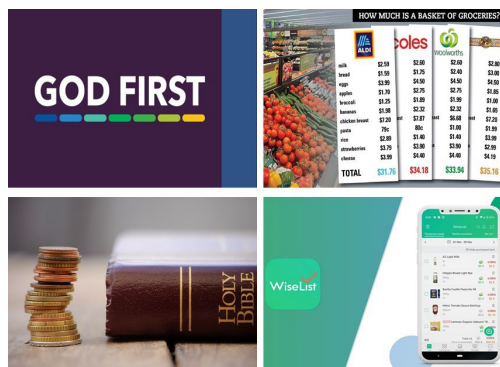
As part of the Regional Meetings held in Townsville, Cairns, Mackay and Darwin from August to October 2022, a workshop on Stewardship was held in the afternoon.

The workshop covered three topics:

- How to reduce costs
- What are the best savings and investments strategies and,
- The solution to debt.

The workshop included practical examples and different types of apps to review our savings and investments according to Biblical principles.

The workshop discussed how to know quick wins in savings, how to reduce grocery bills, swap to cheaper alternatives, and shop for better deals. While the solution to debt looks around understanding debt, working out what we can afford, prioritisation and arranging repayment. The primary purpose is to realign with God's priorities to faithfully give, to bring more souls to the Kingdom.

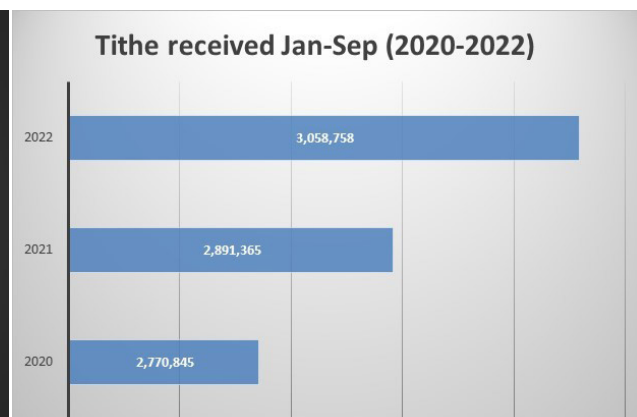
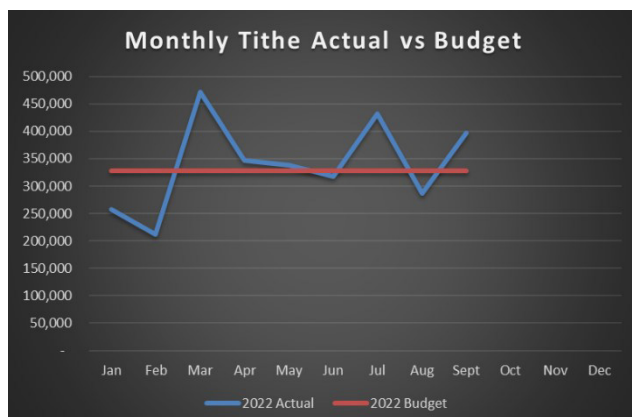

TITHE REPORT

We thank God for His blessings within our Conference and the faithful stewardship of church members in returning their tithes. The cumulative tithe received in September 2022 was higher by 6% compared to 2021, or \$167,393.

The first chart shows the monthly tithe received versus budget, and the second chart shows the cumulative tithe received to September compared against 2021 and 2020.



MEMBERSHIP AND BAPTISM AT THE END OF SEPTEMBER 2022

Church membership has increased by nine people this quarter, at the end of September 2022, from 2,851 to 2,860. The increase in membership was primarily due to baptisms and transfers of membership. Praise the Lord for 17 baptisms this quarter alone.

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- Riverside Estate Development – The tender document to demolish and replace the ablution block, expand the commercial kitchen, and install disability access to the hall has been issued to the prospective builders at the end of October. We are aiming to complete the development before Big Camp 2023.
- Carlisle Car Park Construction – The completion of the car park was pending due to a water easement issue. We have received approval on the easement, and the construction project has started to complete the car park. The plan is to complete construction by year-end.

NEW EDUCATION DIRECTOR FOR NAC

The Northern Australian Conference is happy to announce Graham Baird as our new Education Director. He will be starting his new role in 2023 and we would like to say 'welcome'. Graham has given us a little glimpse into his life and his passion for teaching.

I have had a blessed life. Born to missionary parents I spent my early years in PNG, India, the USA and Singapore, before becoming a student at Avondale College in 1976. In 1977 I married my girlfriend, Caroline, and we became the proud parents of two girls, Natalie and Jodie.

I graduated from Avondale in 1979 with a BEd in Manual Arts and Business and in 1980 accepted a call to be Head of Business at Sonoma College in New Britain. 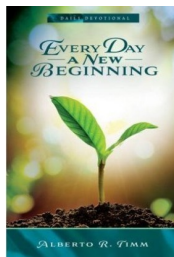
The highlight for many students was meeting and making friends from the other schools. It was great that our three schools were able to join together for this camp and make lasting memories.



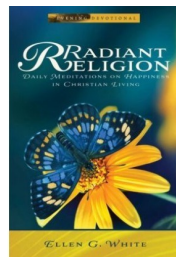
