

I faced new challenges, problems, and matters around staffing appointments, personal issues around the schools, and project delays. 

TITHE REPORT


We thank God for His blessings within our conference and the faithful stewardship of church members in returning their tithes. 2022 had the highest tithe received in the last five years. The first chart shows a comparison of tithe received year on year. Tithe received in 2022 was \$4.12 million, an increase of 7% compared to 2021. We budgeted \$3.93 million for tithe received, and the actual was \$4.12 million or 5% increase. The second chart is the monthly actual tithe received against budget.





MEMBERSHIP AND BAPTISMS AT THE END OF 2022

Membership at the end of 2022 was 2,874, an increase of 70 people or 2.5% from 2021. Praise the Lord for 67 baptism in 2022. Baptisms were the highest in 5 years, as you can see from the baptism year on year chart.



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

- As I write this, the new fence separating the campground and the school is being erected, and the contractor is working on completing it. The fence will help to ensure safety around the campsites and the children at school.
- There was a delayed execution of the Building Better Regions project. As you are probably aware, this project is to demolish and replace the ablution block, expand the commercial kitchen (new cold and dry storage space with outside dining), and install a lift to the hall for disability access. We have to re-tender the project due to the failure of the first tender process.



PASTORAL STAFFING CHANGES

With a new year upon us there have been several pastoral changes in our conference.

Pastor Esava Koro has commenced special leave to become an Australian Defense Force Chaplain full time. As a result, Pastor Ray Hobbs will be moving from Ayr, Bowen and Home Hill Churches to become the senior pastor of Darwin, Malak, Palmerston and Gove Churches.

ADRA

ADRA'S DISASTER MANAGEMENT CYCLE

100 Year 8 students from local Townsville school, Calvary Christian College, visited the ADRA Shed at the Riverside Convention Centre, in early November, to hear about ADRA's Disaster Management Cycle. Pastor Chris Kirkwood, ADRA Director at the Northern Australian Conference, spoke to the groups of students about the five parts of the cycle: Event, Recovery, Response, Mitigation and Preparation. The students also had a chance to see what was in the ADRA shed and essential items needed in response to a natural disaster such as generators, food, clothing, kids toys, mattresses and first aid items. The students were doing an assignment, as part of their Humanities class, to create an Emergency Kit using a box and 10 items that they should have around the house in response to a natural disaster. They could choose between a cyclone, bush fire, flood and earthquake for their assignment. Seeing what is stored at the ADRA shed and what ADRA uses in response to natural disasters was very helpful for them in understanding what they would need. "Any planning for any disaster is crucial," stated Pastor Kirkwood, "being planned and organised ensures the safety of loved ones, pets and property. As we enter into the cyclone season in North Queensland, it is important that everyone, even students, understand how to respond in an emergency and what they can do to help."
