# BEYOND 2023!

As I sit down to write today, I am beginning my 10th week in Northern Australia.

So far, as I've toured the Conference, I've seen some amazing things! For example, 15 years ago, Alice Springs Church had four people present on a Sabbath morning. Today they have between 80-100 people. When I sat down there for lunch on Sabbath – both people I sat close to were in preparation for Baptism.

Similarly, 15 years ago, Katherine Seventh-day Adventist Church had one family in attendance, today they have 60 odd people present for worship on Sabbath morning.

These are not the only good news stories. Our Bible workers at Tennant Creek, Eliki and Loata Vosalevu, have done an amazing job with the folks there. They have nurtured the people through hospitality and good old-fashioned care, and we now have close to 50 people in attendance on Sabbath. One family that joined the church around three years ago have brought a number of other family members to faith in Christ.

Likewise, in Mt Isa, two people have recently made a decision for Baptism and Townsville City Church will be baptising approximately six people in just a few weeks' time.

This is NAC. These are some of the amazing things that are taking place here. I feel blessed to see these things and be part of what's going on and I feel even more excited to see where God leads in the coming years, especially in 2024.

Our Conference Executive committee has decided that we will join the Australian Union Conference, in 2024, for the Year of Evangelism. Why? Simply because in Christ there is life and there is life abundant (John 10:10). In 2024 – I want to do things differently. I want to carry on the good work that is already taking place here. I want to:

# GENERAL SECRETARY/CFO REPORT

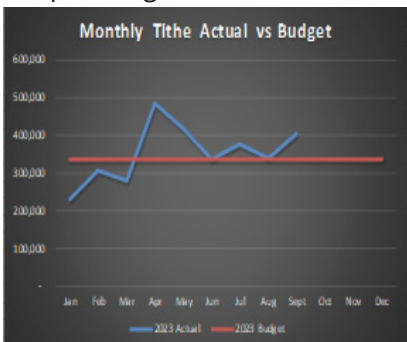
## BAPTISM REPORT

We are delighted to share that we have had 89 baptisms, so far in 2023, up to September, which is the highest number of baptisms in the last five years. Praise the Lord! This quarter, nine souls were baptised in Cooktown/Wujal Wujal, and we extend our heartfelt thanks to Pastor Aporosa, who oversees the region, Pastor Eddie, who has been a key mentor in these areas, and Brendan Davis, the former Bible Worker for Cooktown, for their invaluable contributions. We are grateful for their dedication and hard work in making these baptisms possible.

## TITHE REPORT - AS OF SEPTEMBER 2023

We thank God for His blessings within our Conference and the faithful stewardship of church members in returning their tithes. The cumulative tithe received up to September 2023 is higher than the 2023 budget by \$153,973 and also higher compared to last year by \$125,595.

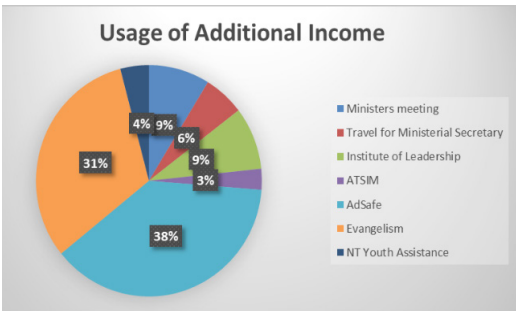
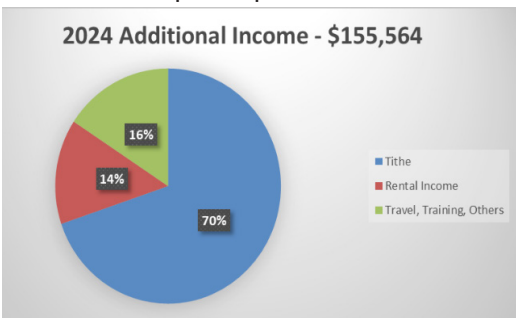
The first chart shows the monthly tithe received versus budget and the second chart shows the cumulative tithe received up to July compared against 2022 and 2021.



## BUDGET REPORT

The NAC Church Budget for 2024 was approved by the Board on November 14. The main priorities and focus for 2024 are to support the year of Evangelism and invest in the engagement and leadership competency of the Ministers and Teachers. To foster new initiatives, we have budgeted for the same trend of tithe that we received in 2023. We have also reviewed the house rental income and performed cost optimization.

The table below shows the additional income from 2023 and the areas of expenditures that will use this additional income. The three main expenditures are Adsafes cost (which is unavoidable and needs to be supported), Evangelism, and Ministers and Leadership Competencies.



## PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

Riverside Estate Development – The project to replace the amenities block and expand the commercial kitchen commenced in October. The project will be completed by Q1 2024 before Big Camp.





## NEW HRIS AND PAYROLL SYSTEM

Our HRIS and Payroll system, TESS, is a major upgrade to our old system. The previous system required a lot of manual work and was very slow. However, the new system will automate many payroll and HR processes, making the whole process more efficient. We are grateful to the South Pacific Division and the Australian Union for allowing us to join the project at a heavily subsidised cost. Keith McDougall has been working very hard on this project for the last 4 months, often sacrificing evenings to ensure its success. I am pleased to announce that the new payroll system was successfully launched in November. Praise the Lord! The system automates tasks like timesheet recording, payroll management, employee recruitment, and more, streamlining the entire process.

## STORMCO

In September, churches in the Northern Territory held two STORMCo's, one in Tennant Creek and the other in Alice Springs. These STORMCo's were run by our local churches who took on the motto that *Service to Others Really Matters*.

From September 24 to October 1, 20 teens from Darwin, Katherine and Mareeba (QLD) held a STORMCo in Tennant Creek. Bible Workers, Eliki and Loata Vosalevu, welcomed the group, who was dedicated to serving the town. Tennant Creek is a central location for the Northern Territory and is the main town for the surrounding Indigenous communities, with hundreds of people visiting the town each day from these communities. During the week the STORMCo team broke into groups to complete different projects such as running a kids club, picking up rubbish, painting the church, holding community BBQ's and spending time with local kids at the Youth Centre.

Our ADRA Director, Pr Chris Kirkwood, drove the ADRA Truck to Tennant Creek also ready to serve and give assistance to the community in the shape of clothing, mattresses, linens and pillows amongst other things. The pop up shop they set up at the church had over 400 people from the community visit on the first day and they had to close the shop after three days as everything had been given away.

The STORMCo had a positive impact, not only for the community, who were able to see God's love in action and where some locals have started attending church, but for the volunteers also.

"It was great to see the kids open up and come out of their shell," said Pr Soani Vosalevu, organiser of the STORMCo trip.

"At first they were nervous and shy but by the end of the week they were more outspoken and relaxed, with many of them now attending Bible studies in their home churches," he added.

Many of the children transformed over the week as confidence in themselves grew with many of them saying they wanted to take what they have learnt at STORMCo to serve in their own local communities

"I learnt that I am capable to help this community and people really appreciate what we are doing," Scarlett, 12, from Palmerston Church.

"Seeing the kids come in (for kids club) everyday was really exciting, I enjoyed being with them and getting to know them," said Allaine, 16, from Darwin.

Since the STORMCo ended, many of the kids have become more involved in the church, not only through Bible studies but in planning to attend future youth events such as Summer Camp and Converge. They are looking forward to holding another STORMCo next year in September and we look forward to seeing the changes in the lives of those in the community and the volunteers.







Alice Springs Church ran a STORMCo, from September 28 to October 4, in conjunction with ELIA Wellness and Adventist Volunteers Service, from the South Pacific Division, the Alice Springs Pathfinders and the Pinnacle of Terror. ELIA Wellness set up 12 stations to complete wellness checks for those in the community, where the Pathfinders worked with health professionals to check blood pressure, sugar levels, body mass index and general wellness. Throughout the week, Pathfinders were involved in various activities including singing in hospitals, while church members conducted prison visits, they were also involved in daily bread runs to Aboriginal communities where Pathfinders ran two kids clubs. Alice Springs has 18 Indigenous communities, or town camps, spread out within the township, and our church has a history of going to these communities to share bread and building relationships.

On the Sabbath, September 30, the first Seventh-day Adventist Church Plant in Yulara, the town next the Uluru, was opened and five people were baptised at the Alice Springs Church. God is really working in the Alice Springs region and we are blessed to have active Pastors and church members going out to do His work. "We have been doing the cycle of evangelism for many years in Alice Springs," stated Pr David Gilmore, Pastor of Alice Springs Church and member of the Institute of Public Evangelism.

"Building relationships with the community, getting to know them and caring for them is an essential part of evangelism, because it shows them God's love before you even introduce them to God," he added, "this is why programs such as STORMCo's are important for our church, they show the community that you care."

We cannot wait to see how God moves in our conference in 2024, as we focus on the year of evangelism and pray our churches continue to hold programs such as STORMCo's to serve the community and show God's love through service.





## TOWNSVILLE CITY CHURCH/AITKENVALE CHURCH

### THE GREAT CONTROVERSY

20 members of the Townsville City Church and Aitkenvale Church distributed this year's sharing book, *The Great Controversy* to Townsville residents on September 16. 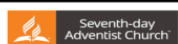
