When will the NDIS begin?

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is a new way of delivering services and support for people with permanent and significant disability in Australia. With the NDIS,

people with disability in Australia. With the New people with disability can choose supports and services to meet their individual needs so that they can live the life they choose.

Services for people with disability will increasingly be provided by non-government organisations, and are likely to cover a wider range than they have in the past. The sorts of services which will be provided include support for daily care and transport, recreational and social activities, and support for education and work.

The Western Adelaide region consists of the following local council areas:

- Charles Sturt
- Port Adelaide Enfield (West)
- West Torrens

The NDIS will begin to roll out for people aged 18 to 64 in Western Adelaide from 1 April 2018. The workforce is estimated to grow from 750 - 900 full time workers to 1,350 - 1,700.

What does this mean for South Australian job seekers?

The workforce in the South Australian disability sector is expanding to support new services which will be available under the NDIS. Up to 6,000 jobs will be created across the state over the next few years.

There will be a wide range of jobs in the sector - from disability support workers to IT workers, physiotherapists, drivers, supervisors, managers and more.
