Position Purpose	To assist the ACT State Team Head Coach in the delivery of Netball ACT's State Team programs by preparing the State Team to compete at the National Netball Championships

ORGANISATIONAL OVERVIEW

Netball ACT is the governing body for Netball in the Australian Capital Territory (ACT). Currently there are five Districts affiliated with Netball ACT: Arawang, Belconnen, Canberra, South Canberra and Tuggeranong.

Netball ACT is responsible for developing and managing netball in the ACT, providing participation opportunities for athletes, coaches, umpires, officials and administrators as well as pathways from grassroots to high performance.

The primary objective of the ACT 19's and 17's State Teams is to identify and select up to twelve (12) eligible players of each age groups capable of achieving success at the National Netball Championships.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- Promote and lead a high-performance culture, and NACT visions and values; within the state team environment
- Assist the Head Coach in the design, delivery and implementation of a State Team Program that addresses the needs of the team
- Assist in the delivery of all court, conditioning sessions, camps and match play as directed by the State Team Head Coach
- In consultation with the State Team Head Coach provide appropriate feedback to facilitate individual athlete performance and team improvement
- Actively contribute and be present for Netball ACT coach meetings
- Assist in accurate recordkeeping of athlete attendance and performance at all scheduled training sessions
- Manage and maintain the program equipment in conjunction with Netball ACT staff
- Contribute and assist with the development of the final report

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

Essential

- Netball Australia Intermediate Level Coaching Accreditation or higher
- Previous experience planning, implementing and evaluating netball training programs at a minimum District Association Representative level
- Previous experience coaching athletes in your nominated age category with particular focus on District Association Representative Teams
- Knowledge of Netball ACT's and Netball Australia's athlete pathways
- Understanding of holistic athlete preparation including sport psychology themes like team cohesion, mental preparation and goal setting as well recovery strategies
- Strong interpersonal skills including communication and leaderships skills with the ability to be a good role model
- Working with Vulnerable people check

Desired

- Current first aid certificate
- Level 1 and 2 ASADA certificates

APPOINTMENT CONDITIONS

Terms

The Netball ACT State Team Assistant Coaches will be appointed for six (6) months to encompass the preparation and competition of the National Netball Championships. In 2019 the National Netball Championships will be held in Brisbane from the 10th to 16th April 2019. Successful applicants will need to be available to travel to the NNC competition during this time. Further details of the term will be outlined in the letter of offer and agreement.

Remuneration

An honorarium will be provided for the services of this position. Details will be stated within the volunteer deed agreement and represents payments made by direct debit to the incumbents identified bank account. The payment will be made at the completion of the program once the final report is submitted and will be made upon receipt of a Statement by Supplier and Tax Invoice.

Hours of Work

As a volunteer position, the working hours will vary depending on the time dictated by the training program. The training program will be drafted in conjunction with the State Team Head Coach and Netball ACT Talent and Performance staff and will included afternoon and weekend sessions.

Working with Vulnerable People Check

As the position requires the incumbent to work closely with children, the State Team Assistant Coach must be prepared to complete a Working with Vulnerable People Check.
