DRAFT 2019 – 2021 WANL PLAYER POINTS SYSTEM

1. Players are assigned a points value based on their level of competition over the previous 3 seasons.
2. Open squads are to consist of 12 players. The total number of points of any list should not exceed the set Player Points System (PPS) limit.
3. The PPS limit will be set by NWA. The aim of the PPS is to create an even competition for both performance and competition interest reasons.
4. It will be the responsibility of the Licensee to ensure the squad list falls within the PPS when submitting their player list by the due date set by Netball WA.
5. Should any Licensee playing list be over the allocated PPS, NWA has the right to put in place any penalty it deems necessary. This may include any of the following;
 - a. Fine
 - b. Loss of points
 - c. Exclusion from the competition
6. The PPS does not apply to the playing lists for the Women's 20U and Men's Open division.
7. Temporary and permanent replacement players must fall within the PPS. This includes any player from the Women's 20U division playing up and becoming a temporary or permanent replacement player in the Women's Open division.
8. Permanently contracted West Coast Fever players are exempt from the PPS. West Coast Fever players will be allocated to the WANL Clubs by West Coast Fever Netball Club. The West Coast Fever Clubs decision on allocations will be final.
9. Any WANL player who signs on with West Coast Fever as either a temporary or permanent replacement player during the season may stay on their WANL club's playing list. To be eligible to play finals, that player must have played in a minimum of 3 WANL games during the season for that club. The WANL club may sign a temporary or permanent replacement player for the period of the West Coast Fever replacement.
10. Categories for the PPS are as follows

Category 1 (30 points)

- A player (not playing netball in WA at age 14) who is currently under contract or has been at any stage within the last 3 seasons been permanently contracted to a NNL (Australia, New Zealand, England or South Africa) team.

Category 2 (20 points)

- A player (who played netball in WA at age 14) who is currently under contract or has been at any stage within the last 3 seasons been permanently contracted to a NNL (Australia, New Zealand, England or South Africa) team.

Category 3 (15 points)

- A player who has played a minimum of 12 quarters at ANL level in any one season within the previous 3 seasons.

Category 4 (12 points)

- A player who has played 200 or more WANL matches in the top division.

Category 5 (10 points)

- A player who has played 100 to 199 WANL matches in the top division.
- A player who has previously played 18U & above in another State League competition. *
- A player from overseas who is in Australia on a visa for study/work/netball *

Category 6 (8 points)

- A player who has played 50 to 99 WANL matches in the top division.

Category 7 (5 points)

- A player who has played 25 to 49 WANL matches in the top division.
- A player who has played in the 17U &/or 19U National Netball Carnival within the previous 3 seasons

Category 8 (2 points)

- A player who has played 0 to 24 WANL matches in the top division.

* A player who has become a permanent resident of Western Australia and played for 3 consecutive seasons in WANL will be classed as local player and classified as such.

Players will be classified at the highest level i.e. a player who is a WA resident and has played 65 WANL games (Category 6) and has held a permanent SSN contract anytime within the previous 3 seasons (Category 2) will be classified as Category 2.
