Key Working Relationships

Accountable to the Participation Manager and other Participation staff for the delivery of junior introductory netball programs across South Australia.

Responsible to the Participation team and other Community Coaches for creating an environment of teamwork that is based on collaboration, mutual respect and trust.

Summary of the broad purpose of the position

To provide quality introductory netball programs for junior players within South Australia which emphasise skill development and active participation in a safe and enjoyable environment. Primarily, the position will implement the Netball SA Sporting Schools program and provide opportunities for every young person to participate in and progress through the Netball Australia player pathway. The Community Netball Coach will be providing many children with their first experience of Netball.

Position Responsibilities

- Conduct Sporting Schools program throughout metropolitan South Australia.
 - Conduct NetSetGO clinics throughout metropolitan and regional South Australia.
 - Promote and support Netball SA's aims and objectives of junior development across SA.
 - Maintain records and submit information in accordance with Netball SA.
 - Maintain regular correspondence with Netball SA Participation staff in reference to availability and program implementation.
 - Abide by, promote and actively enforce Netball SA policies.
 - Attend Community Coach Development workshops.
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Position Strategic Outcomes

- Ability to work with people across all levels of the sport, including Netball SA staff, association representatives, school personnel, players and children.
 - Effective and regular liaison with Netball SA Participation staff.
 - Implement high quality netball programs and create a positive sporting experience for junior participants.
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Selection Criteria

Candidates for the position of Community Coach will require coaching experience of junior players, as well as having a range of personal and professional skills. The following skills and qualifications are essential requirements for the position:

- NCAS Foundation coaching accreditation or higher (or be intending to gain in 2019).
- Current member of Netball SA.
- Current Working with Children Check (DHS).
- Current drivers licence and vehicle.
- Outstanding organisational skills, excellent communication and interpersonal skills.

Other Information

As a member of Netball SA staff, the Community Coach will display characteristics such as reliability, punctuality and courtesy, and be self-motivated and well presented at all times when representing Netball SA.

Working hours will be determined by the needs of the programs. The Community Coach will be required to work both during and after school hours. The Community Coach will also be required during school holiday periods. This position would suit university students, mothers wishing to work school hours and candidates with other flexible working arrangements.

Netball SA carries out performance appraisals, against pre-determined performance objectives on an annual basis. All Community Netball Coach's will be paid on an hourly rate, in accordance with Netball SA policy and the Sporting Organisations Award (2010).

Written applications are invited from suitably qualified people detailing skills and experience relevant to this position. Only applications addressing the selection criteria will be considered.
