

## **Dorolyn's Story**

Pastor Dorolyn Laloyer retired 2 years ago as the first commissioned pastor

in the Vanuatu Mission. However, since retiring, Dorolyn has been very active in ministry. Straight after retirement she began the first French-speaking church in Port Vila, the capital city. Dorolyn learnt French as an adult through her husband's family. French is one of the official languages of Vanuatu along with Bislama and English. They started with a handful of people. Two years later they have 33 baptised members, 50 adults attending and more than 50 children at the weekly Sab-

bath services. All the weekly Bible studies, prayer meetings or Sabbath programs are conducted in French.



In July this year they conducted a public evangelistic program in French as part of the TPUM Pente-

cost harvest.

Pastor Laloyer is not just growing a church but also other women in ministry. She is mentoring 4 other ladies in ministry in the Vanuatu Mission – the most senior being Loloth Worwor, who is the Women's and Children's Ministry Director. The 2 that work around Port Vila were actively involved in the weekend programs. If God calls ladies into such ministry Dorolyn is very supportive of them.

The South Pacific Division needs more women in leadership, pastoral ministry and church employment.

# **Calling Women**

Is God calling you to serve in senior church administration? Perhaps you think this kind of work is reserved ordained pastors. Let me share with you some facts.

By policy the president of a conference, mission, union, division and General Conference needs to be an ordained pastor? In the South Pacific Division that means 40 employees are required to be ordained men.

There are 63 positions where that requirement does not exist. Therefore, we could have 63 women in

senior administrative positions in the church: all the secretaries, treasurers, associate secretaries and associate CFOs could be women.

Do you know how many women are currently in those positions?

Nine (9).

We could employ 54 women in senior administrative and leadership positions across our division.

We are looking for capable women who are willing to serve the church in such capacities. We are looking for women to serve on boards of the church companies. We are looking for treasurers, secretaries and their associates.

Are you one such woman?

Are you preparing yourself by education and experience to serve in such capacity?

Is God telling you he needs you to lead the church in such places?

How will you answer God's call?
