What Matters Most?

I shared a message recently where I talked about 'What Matters Most'. After some prayer and reflection, I concluded that what matters most is people. Money, possessions, qualifications and other attributes are nice things to have, and we need them to a certain extent, but they are not what matters most – people matter most. And when we talk about people, we talk about relationships.

Balancing and prioritising time is important to foster the four types of relationships. Jesus would spend time with His father early in the morning to recharge, and through that connection be equipped to deal with other forms of relationships. We may prefer to connect with God at different times of the day but should in one way or another imitate Jesus' connection recipe.

A meaningful connection with our family and friends is also very important and cannot be neglected. We see so many broken homes around us because not enough time is dedicated to growing relationships. We all know that it is not so much about the quantity of time but the quality of time that makes a difference in relationship building.

In my experience, the practice of having a relationship with self in the sense of taking time to look after our minds and bodies is the most neglected, which in the long-term results in various forms of physical and mental health issues. Another relationship that is often disregarded is the relationship with creation. As stewards of this planet, we sometimes forget our responsibility to protect, preserve, and speak against environmental degradation. Finding the right balance and prioritising what matters most in our relationships is a skill that we can all learn and develop.

What about you? What matters most for you? If it is relationships, think how intentional you have been about them, and whether there are any changes you need to make.
