But half of this year's artists are new to the festival, many new to Australia. They are all fabulous performers and great company and I look forward to them forging ongoing relationships with Australia. This year we celebrate Paul Stanhope as our Composer-in-Residence. Performers love playing his music! At the Families' Concert, we'll present Oscar Wilde's enchanting fairy tale *The Happy Prince* in its musical realisation by the late Malcolm Williamson, his inspired response to Britten's *Noye's Fludde*, which was such a hit three years ago.


Immediately prior to this year's festival, I shall be the Artistic Director and Chair of the Jury for the Sydney International Piano Competition, which only takes place every four years and is one of the most important events of its kind in the world.

One of the first engagements the winner will undertake is an appearance at AFCM with the chamber music artists who perform with the semi-finalists in the competition – the irrepressible Tasmin Little and our own Quartet-in-Residence, the Goldner String Quartet, who will commence an on-going cycle of the complete quartets by Beethoven at this year's festival.

The Townsville Council will co-present another free concert in the Queens Gardens to celebrate its special year and its special relationship with our festival. The '1812' was such a huge hit last year we simply had to repeat it. We'll see if the audience can make an even bigger racket for cannon fire this year! The Barrier Reef Orchestra and the 1RAR Band will be our collaborators again for this fun occasion and I'm pleased that actor Brendan O'Connor. lan Brunskill and other Townsville musicians will join us too.

I hope you enjoy browsing through the program. There is something for everyone and the blissful winter ambience in Townsville is in any case a balm for every woe. Incidentally, we're off to the magical Orpheus Island again for a concert on the beach. Last time we went there were whales to watch on the journey.

Do think about making your own winter journey to Townsville this year and we promise we'll keep you happy and entertained...

Since 2007 he has been Artistic Director of the Australian Festival of Chamber Music.

He has recorded over fifty CDs on major labels. Awaiting release are another Piers Goes to Town recital disc; a second edition of British Sonatas with violinist Tasmin Little; concertos by Walter Braunfels, Alfred Hill and George Boyle; and the Bruch Piano Quintet, the eighth disc he has recorded with the Goldner String Quartet. Many composers have written for him and he has premiered works by Brett Dean, Dave Heath, Colin Matthews, Richard Mills, Carl Vine, Benjamin Wallfisch and Malcolm Williamson.

He has written and presented over 100 programs for BBC Radio 3; is the Artistic Director of the Sydney International Piano Competition 2016; holds Honorary Doctorates from Griffith University and James Cook University; and in 1994 was made an Honorary Member of the Royal Academy of Music, where he was a professor from 1989 to 2007.

He is President of the European Piano Teachers Association UK and Patron of the Australasian Piano Pedagogy Conference, the Old Granary Studio in Norfolk, the Tait Memorial Trust in London. the Youth Music Foundation of Australia, the Music Teachers Association and The Accompanists Guild in Queensland. He is a Trustee of the Hattori Foundation in London and Vice-President of Putney Music Club. In the Queens Diamond Jubilee Birthday Honours, he was made an Officer in the Order of Australia (AO).
