














Discover BTC

We invite you to join our team for a tour of the College exploring the learning and boarding environments, meeting our staff and students and experiencing first hand what it means to GO IT BLUE!






















Junior School

Our Junior School nurtures children from Kindy to Year 6, developing strong foundations in literacy, numeracy and social-emotional learning. Students are engaged in 21st century education, guided by outstanding teachers and support staff. Our early years students are immersed in high-quality instruction in reading, writing and mathematics, with a balance of play-based learning and formal instruction designed to prepare all students with the skills they need for success throughout their schooling journey. In the middle primary years, Junior School students consolidate these foundations and navigate the increases in curriculum expectations, whilst being guided and supported with their personal wellbeing and shaping of identity by our passionate and professional teaching staff. Our upper primary students are compassionate and connected leaders, reflecting the values and ethos of the College. They explore links between curriculum and community, and are intentionally readied for their transition to Secondary School by accessing specialist teachers for Health & Physical Education, Visual Arts, Manual Arts, Food & Nutrition and Drama. Our students have access to a range of co-curricular activities each term which include all seasonal sport, interschool activities, dance and instrumental music.

The Junior School is far more than just a place where students receive an excellent academic education; it is a kind, welcoming, family-orientated community where the College spirit and values are reflected in all that we do.













Secondary School

The Secondary setting provides an opportunity for students in Year 7 to 12 to learn and experience the traditional values of what it means to GO IT BLUE as a member of the Blackheath & Thornburgh Community. These values support students to grow and develop into responsible, respectful and accountable young adults in a time of rapid social change. Our educators and boarding staff are supported by specialised a pastoral team including Year Coordinators, Student Support Officer, College Psychologist, Health Centre Team and our Community Education Officer to assist students in navigating the challenges through adolescence.

Secondary students are provided with stimulating learning environments promoting opportunities to explore all elements of the core and elective curriculum through traditional classroom learning programs, specialist learning opportunities, engagement with community, house based activities, an extensive co-curricular program and a wide range of school developed opportunities.



BYOD @ BTC

Blackheath & Thornburgh College is a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) School from Year 7 to 12. While there is a great deal of choice in today's market, our program refers to a laptop or similar approved device to enable students to access curriculum resources, learning experiences and collaborate with their peers. Our staff recognise the importance of authentic, relevant and rich learning tasks and as such utilise student devices to supplement and support learning across the school. In a dynamic and ever changing world our BYOD program enables our team of educators to be innovative and responsive to the needs of 21st Century learners.

In our Junior School setting, students develop the foundational skills required to explore, decipher and interact with modern stimulus through a range of learning experiences. Year 3-6 students have access to dedicated laptop trolleys, whilst our P-2 students engage with technology through interactive presentation tools and shared iPads.





