
Centacare NQ's safeguarding framework is guided by relevant legislation, standards and Catholic Church safeguarding frameworks including:

- Queensland Family and Child Commission Act 2014 (Qld)
- Human Rights Act 2019 (Qld)
- Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth)
- Disability Services Act 2006 (Qld) & NDIS Act 2013 (Cth), NDIS Act 2013 (Cth), NDIS Practice Standards and NDIS Code of Conduct (where applicable)

- Implementing systems, practices and safeguards that reduce the risk of harm and promote safe participation, inclusion and wellbeing

- Promoting a culture that supports the early identification and appropriate response to concerns, disclosures, allegations or suspicions of harm.
- Reporting concerns, disclosures and allegations in accordance with legislative requirements. Upholding our obligations under the Queensland Reportable Conduct Scheme and, where applicable, the NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission requirements.
- Preventing Modern Slavery and taking proactive measures to ensure that children, young people, and vulnerable individuals, in our operations and supply chains are not subject to exploitation
- Contributing to the promotion of safeguarding practices across the communities and regions in which we operate
