2021 proved to be another year of change and challenge for Centacare NQ and our community more broadly. I am both proud of and inspired by the staff who have continued to remain steadfast in our combined commitment to our organisational mission: 'Wellbeing for All'

As Covid-19 continued to impact on a global scale, we looked to our core values to guide our work on a local basis. Values such as respect, dignity, compassion, equality and stewardship were the foundation. We respected the inherent worth of all and were able to navigate challenges to ensure the individuals, families and communities we worked with still had access to our services. Our services were provided in a manner that responded to need in a compassionate and dignified way. And we understood and valued the importance of caring for all of the resources we have, financial, material, spiritual and environmental.

In the spirit of Pope Francis's encyclical 'Fratelli Tutti'; 2021 provided a reminder that our connection to others is the cornerstone of wellbeing. In a time where many were isolated from kin, or disconnected from supports, the way we delivered services maintained a particular focus on ensuring all people we worked with were connected to people, supports, services and had an understanding of how to navigate challenges more effectively.

Centacare NQ is 43 years strong and our continued commitment to wellbeing for all has made a difference to countless people. Our feedback tells us that over 95% of people reported increased capacity across one or more areas of their life after participating in our services. Through community consultation we humbly acknowledge the appreciation our clients offered us for providing a service that made them feel respected, valued, and unashamed (October World Café community Consultations) and that more than 85% of clients who participated in a feedback survey noted they felt safer and/or their circumstances had improved.

"Let us not grow tired" was the message from St Paul to the Galatians (Gal.6:9-10) in looking after each other and doing work that is good. Centacare NQ is the social services ministry of the Catholic Diocese of Townsville and as we continue our work across the diocese, I offer my gratitude to all Staff, Management and Senior Leaders who contributed to the achievement of our goals. I also acknowledge the support and contribution of our Council, Chaired by Fr Rod Ward, and Bishop Tim Harris. Centacare NQ continues to achieve because of the combined efforts of many and it is my privilege to lead the organisation as we embark on the next chapter.




