	As a general principle, girls are not permitted to wear bike pants under their College shorts. In specific instances, where the wearing of bike pants for specific HPE activities is permitted, girls may wear them under their shorts for the particular activity.	
Socks	College pattern, white with one navy and one gold band	
Footwear	Jogger style sport shoes with laces are permitted. High tops, skate shoes, volleys or leisure footwear (e.g. Vans) are not permitted as they do not offer sufficient support for some physical activities).	

Years 7, 8 and 9 Students may wear their Sports Uniform on days when Health & Physical Education (HPE) practical lessons are scheduled on the student's individual timetable. It is recommended that students have two Sports Uniforms. The Sports Uniform remains the same throughout all year levels.

Years 10, 11 and 12 Students will have the option of choosing 'sports' subjects, therefore, some students may require an extra Sports Uniform.

Students enrolled in Health & Physical Education (HPE) or Physical Education (PE)

Students enrolled in HPE or PE may only wear the Sports Uniform on practical lesson days as nominated by their teacher.

Senior students (Year 10-12) NOT enrolled in Health & Physical Education (HPE) or Physical Education (PE)

Students not enrolled in HPE or PE may wear the Sports Uniform on Wednesdays only.

Students enrolled in Aquatic Practices

Students who choose to study Aquatic Practices will need a Sports Uniform as they are worn on excursions and other activities related to that subject.

All Students are required to wear the Sports Uniform for interhouse and interschool sporting competitions unless otherwise advised.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Full Uniform	Students are required to wear the full Formal or Sports Uniform to and from school.		
Security	All articles of clothing should be clearly marked with the student's name.		
•			
Condition of Uniform	Uniform must be clean, neat and in good order.		
	Additions, alterations or substitutions are not accepted unless the Year Level Dean has been given a note from the student's parent/carer which states the reason for the substitution and the length of time this will occur.		
	A 'Uniform Stamp' is issued for single days of incorrect uniform explained by a note from parents.		
Headwear	College broad-brim hat or College cap must be worn during recess breaks, unless undercover, and for all outdoor activities.		
	For formal occasions, such as the ANZAC Day Parade, the broad-brim hat must be worn.		
	New students starting at Holy Spirit College will be presented with a broad-brim hat as a gift at enrolment. This has been made possible through the generosity of the P&F Association.		
HSC Jacket or Jumper	College pattern and crest		
	The existing Cantebury-brand Jacket and knitted jumper (worn with either Formal or Sports Uniform) will be phased out over the next two years (2023-2024) and will be replaced by the new formal soft shell jacket.		
	No other jackets or jumpers (including HSC sports team jumpers) may be worn.		
Senior Jersey	Year 12 Students may wear the Senior Jersey with the Sports Uniform on Wednesdays during Term 3 only.		
Footwear	Leather, closed-in shoes must be worn at all times in the Design & Technology, Science and Home Economics areas, even on Non-Uniform 'free dress' days, as a requirement of Workplace Health and Safety (WH&S) legislation.		
	Jogger style sport shoes with laces are permitted.		
	High tops, skate shoes, volleys or leisure footwear (e.g. Vans) are not permitted as they do not offer sufficient support for some physical activities).		
Boys Appearance	Boys are expected to be clean shaven.		
	No facial hair (beards and moustaches) are to be evident.		
	Side burns must not extend below the ear lobe.		
Jewellery	Only the following jewellery may be worn:		
	Students may wear a wrist watch, small gold or silver cross / religious medallion on a thin chain.		
	• Students with pierced ears may wear matching plain silver or gold sleepers (no greater than 12mm diameter) or silver, gold, white pearl or clear stone studs (no greater than 5mm diameter) with no more than two in each ear lobe. Decorative earrings and adornments are not permitted.		
	No other visible piercings (including clear plastic studs) are permitted.		
	Band-Aids cannot be worn over piercings.		
	Confiscated jewellery may be collected by a parent from the Student Services Hub or collected by a student at the end of the term. Parents/carers may apply to collect confiscated jewellery via the Year Level Dean.		
Tattoos	Tattoos are not to be visible at any time.		
	Tattoos are to be covered at all times when wearing the College uniform and at all College-related activities.		
Hair	Hair should be clean, brushed, generally neat and conservative in nature.		
	Hair longer than collar length should be tied back behind the head (boys and girls). If hair ribbons or small scrunchies are worn they must be deep red, yellow gold or navy blue (the College colours).		
	Students are expected to wear their uniform in a way which reflects pride in the College and their own appearance. Hair styles should be appropriate to this image and more 'eccentric / extreme' styles are not acceptable.		
	As a guide, the following hair cuts/styles are not permitted: dreadlocks; cornrows; mullets; less than blade three; spiked; undercut; wedge cut; tracks; extreme variations to normal colour (including excessive bleaching).		

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (cont'd)

Make-Up	No visible make-up is to be worn, including tinted moisturising lotion, blemish cream and sunscreen.	
	No false eyelashes or eyelash extensions are permitted. No false nails or coloured nail varnish is to be worn. This includes French manicure.	
Swimming Attire	Rugby/Athletics/Speedo style shorts (or similar length) are to be worn by male and female students in swimming classes. (No long board shorts are permitted due to drag in the water.)	
	One-piece swimmers or sports style two-piece swimmers (i.e. crop top or sports style top) are to be worn by female students in swimming classes. Bikinis (without shirt covering) are not acceptable.	
	Sun shirts/rashies are encouraged. T-shirts are discouraged (due to weight in water).	
Track pants	Girls and boys may wear the HSC track pants in the cooler months with the Sports shirt.	
T-Shirts under Uniform	In cooler weather, students are permitted to wear a singlet beneath their school shirts provided no part is visible at the neck, tail or beyond the sleeves.	

NON-UNIFORM DAYS (FREE DRESS)

Students may come to school in 'free dress' on specified days such as Retreats,
Camps and Free Dress 'Theme' Days.

Dress guidelines for students include:

- · attire must be neat, tidy, modest and conservative in nature
- clothing with inappropriate prints/slogans are not permitted
- · clothing showing bare mid-riff is not permitted
- shirts and t-shirts must have sleeves (shoe-string straps are not permitted)
- appropriate clothing must be worn in all practical classes (e.g. leather, closed-in shoes must be worn at all times in the Design & Technology, Science and Home Economics areas)
- · thongs and slide-on scuffs are not permitted
- students should consider the likely activities undertaken when deciding what to wear skirts may not be appropriate for physical activities

Questions Relating to Uniform Requirements - If there are any doubts concerning uniform requirements students/parents should seek guidance from the Assistant Principal - Students. In all matters of uniform and grooming, the College reserves the right to ask students to change or adjust aspects of dress and grooming.
