GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Thursday 3rd March 2022 at 9.00 am

RESOLVED – That the minutes be approved. (Ms CA Coppo and Cr WG Skinner - carried)

D. WORKS REPORT – The Trust Engineer, Mr Tim Smith, provided an update of works for the month of February.

DRFA Revegetation Work. Contractor - W & T Bails Tree Lopping (Wayne Forden)

Work is starting on the Waterview Creek sites – Zatta and Clerk and others. The sites will be cleared/slashed, raked and planted. I have also asked the contractor to do the North Bank site (Palmas) as soon as possible to complete the project.

That will involve planting of about three hundred trees.

After that, the contractor will prepare and plant Trovato and Porta.

QRRRF 2021-22

Expressions of Interest were submitted for two projects:

<u>Priority 1</u>: Herbert River. Upgrade the Ripple and Catherina Creek floodgate control systems.

An upgrade will allow remote monitoring of the floodgates thereby avoiding the need for an operator to travel to the riverbank sites during flood events. This would improve responsiveness and timely operation of the floodgates by operators. This will reduce the risk of delays in closing the gates because of flooded access and reduce the risk of inundation of extensive areas away from the river that delayed closing causes. Upgrading is proposed for both the Ripple and Catherina Creek flood gate control systems.

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Estimated cost has been developed from preliminary prices and quotations. At this stage, advice on instrumentation and estimated cost has been obtained from a local instrument contractor. Final cost will come out of a formal tender process. The Trust has also sought information on similar control systems operating elsewhere and is confident the proposed remote monitoring and operating system will sort out the problems it has operating the floodgates at Catherina and Ripple Creeks.

Estimated cost: Ripple Creek - \$19,600, Catherina Creek - \$21,100 and project management - \$2,500. Total: \$43,200

Priority 2: Herbert River. Reprofiling Castorina Island. Flood mitigation for Lower Herbert.

Reprofiling Castorina Island to improve the waterway area available in the river channel for moderate and major floods. Improvements to the river channel will reduce the frequency of overbank flood breakouts into Cordelia and Macknade. The project will extend the benefit that has resulted from works done by the Trust to reprofile islands below Halifax, upstream at the Macknade cane rail bridge and preliminary works on Castorina Island.

Ongoing benefits: Improvements for the communities of Cordelia and Halifax from the work in the river have been confirmed by the recent flood modelling. The flood model will be run again by the Trust's consultants, Venant Solutions, after the project is completed with the topographical changes to the island included in the model run to quantify further improvement in that reach of the river.

<u>Estimated cost</u>: Topographical surveys (before and after) - \$15,000, construct access - \$20,000, earthworks - \$450,000 (60,000m3 x \$7.50) and supervision/other overheads - \$25,000. Total: \$510,000

Inspections

- Mark Zatta (Abergowrie, Herbert River) bank erosion during recent river flood, and
- B and W Valinoti (Halifax Road) bank erosion on the riverbank estimated to be twenty metres long.

Both are to be considered for a future Annual Works Program.
