Uniform Schedule:

Students must wear the school uniform according to the following rotation:

When children are wearing the school uniform outside of school premises/hours, it should be worn with pride and decorum.

On occasion, students may be required to wear either of these uniforms when representing the school.

To ensure all students are wearing the correct uniform, the below steps are in place:

1. Parents are to notify the school if their child is out of uniform.
2. Classroom teachers will give verbal reminders to children, particularly children out of uniform without an explanation from their parents.
3. Children who are consistently out of uniform will have a COMPASS reminder sent to parents.

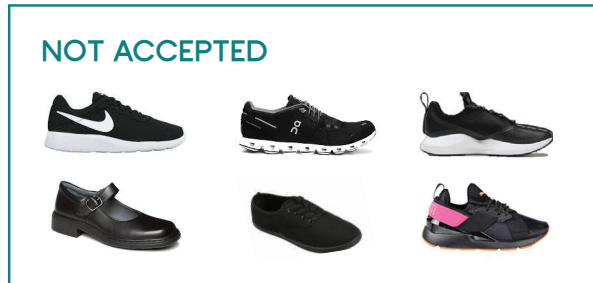

Shoes:

Black shoes to always be worn with the school uniform.



WET WEATHER

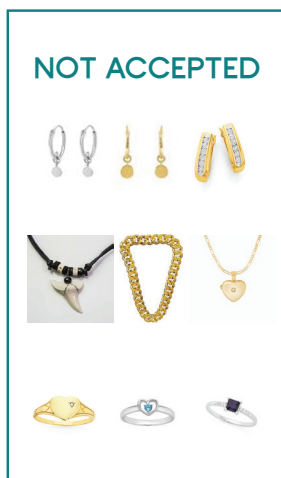
Children can adapt foot attire if the weather remains wet for long periods of time eg sandals, crocs or thongs. Children should always have their school shoes in their bag to be able comply with our Workplace Health and Safety regulations if required. No bare feet are permitted.

Jewellery:

The following jewellery may be worn at school. The selection is primarily based on the need for school pride, Workplace Health and Safety issues and in the interests of a 'uniform' dress code. All of the following apply to girls and boys:

Students may wear:

- A simple watch – not a smart watch.
- A religious necklace (crucifix, holy medal or scapular).
- One earring per ear, all earrings must be plain studs or sleepers (eg. birthstone, silver or gold).
- No dangling earrings (A reminder that sleepers may be dangerous in some games and activities).



Hats:

The school hat is the same for both academic and sports uniforms and all children are to wear their hats at all times when outside the classroom. This includes before school, breaks, outdoor activities, such as PE. Children without a hat will be asked to sit in the eating areas or shaded areas where supervision is provided. This is to keep in line with our Sunsafe Policy.

Hair and Grooming:

Hair should be clean and brushed and in hairstyles that are simple and neat.

Hair of shoulder length or longer must be tied back with a band, clip or ribbon that is red, teal, white or the same colour as their hair.

Please note: The School Leadership Team deems what is appropriate with regard to new and emerging hair trends.

There should be no dramatic differences in hair length eg not shaved / short on sides and or top but long at the back. Artificial colouring (other than the child's natural hair colour) is not permitted.

Children **MUST NOT** be at school with:

- Coloured hair and or 'tracks'
- coloured varnished nails
- hand drawings or writing on skin
- tattoos or decals
- rings / bangles / wristbands

Hair must be tied back when at an appropriate length. The School Administration reserves the right to insist on appropriate hair length, design, cut and colour.

Personal Communication Devices:

Holy Spirit catholic School promotes the importance of using communication device technology for educational purposes. The school also recognises a need to identify and address issues of students 'inappropriate use of personal communication devices. We understand that parents may provide their children with personal communication devices (mobile phones) for safety reasons, however, the school's policy is that these mobile phones and any other devices (e.g. smart watches) use are not to be used on the school grounds or at school events.

The policy extends to students attending school excursions, camps, or extracurricular activities.

Parents are reminded that the School Administration Office is the only appropriate point of contact for reaching their child during school hours.

If a mobile phone is brought to school, it must be switched off and handed into the class teacher or the School Administration Office whilst on the school property or involved in school activities, including breaks.

Smart watches are not permitted at school as per the uniform guidelines.
