At the Marian Catholic School we believe that all members of our school community have the right to feel safe and every child has the right to learn.

CODE OF BEHAVIOUR	
The following responsibilities are the basis of our code of behaviour. At Marian Catholic School: 1. We respect ourselves and others in: • Language • Work • Play	BREACHES OF THESE BEHAVIOURS This code is breached by: • Swearing, cruelty in language to other children/adults, teasing, being rude, exclusion, degrading language. This code is breached by: • A refusal to participate and a refusal to follow teacher's instruction. This code is breached by: • Pushing and shoving others, not keeping hands and feet to self, spitting, crowding.
2. We respect our property and the property of others.	This code is breached by: Defacing school or personal property, breaking school or personal property with intent, taking school or personal property without permission.
3. We wear our uniform with pride.	 This code is breached by: Incorrect attention to uniform This code is defined by: Wearing the school hat, long hair tied back and correct uniform, neat clothing and appearance, wearing socks above the ankle and black shoes.
4. We participate to the best of our abilities in all school activities.	This code is breached by: • A refusal to participate and a refusal to follow teachers'/staff instruction.
5. We follow safety rules at all times.	This code is breached by: ◆ Running on concrete, running up and down stairs, using playground equipment dangerously, riding bikes or skateboards in the school grounds, being in out of bounds areas/classrooms without supervision.

DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Observe out of bounds areas
- Assist in maintaining the cleanliness of school environments
- Present in the uniform designated
- To be on time for all classes
- To demonstrate respect for self, staff, other students and all school visitors

CLARIFICATION

Our policy acknowledges the changing nature of society and the wide range of personal problems brought to school. When combined with the complex nature of student/ teacher relationships, it is easy to understand how problems occur.

Children will, and should, provide feedback regarding their school lives to their parents or guardians. Sometimes certain feedback may cause concern to parents or guardians. Such concern may prompt a visit by parents/ guardians to the school, to advise staff or to seek clarification. The school welcomes your input since it is plainly obvious that despite our best efforts it is humanly impossible for staff to be aware of every single situation.

PROCESS

In advising staff of your concerns the following should be kept in mind so that the best possible conclusion is reached for your child.

- 1. Keep an open mind, children in primary years are naturally self centred and hence the wider picture is often not presented to parents.
- 2. Spend a little time in the consideration of the information given by your child. It is a natural instinct to respond immediately in support of your child. However, immediate responses are often impulsive and therefore it is difficult to successfully address the concern.
- 3. Where a situation occurs several times it is important to contact the class teacher. However, keep in mind behaviour exhibited in the classroom situation is not necessarily translated to the playground. This means that the class teacher is not necessarily aware of situations arising out of play time. Your input then is valuable in alerting all staff to possible interventions.
- 4. Unless the situation is of an extremely sensitive nature, you should contact the class teacher or teacher concerned rather than the Principal. These are the people closest to the incident and your child.
- 5. Intervention by the Principal occurs when satisfaction regarding an incident is not forthcoming after talks with the teacher concerned.
