STATEMENT OF POLICY

Marian Catholic School is committed to providing a sense of identity and belonging through the wearing of the school uniform.

INTRODUCTION

The policy addresses the need for equity and to provide consistent and clear expectations for uniform and appearance.

RATIONALE

The uniform identifies students as members of the Marian Catholic School community. It promotes a sense of identity and pride; helps strengthen school community cohesion; enhances students' safety and wellbeing; and prepares students for the expectations of secondary school, and beyond.

It is a collective responsibility of all to ensure that uniform requirements apply to every student.

POLICY DIRECTIVE

Students of Marian Catholic School are expected to wear the correct school uniform and ensure that their personal appearance meets school expectations.

The School uniform is designed to:

- Be affordable for families;
- Meet Sun Safety Policy requirements;
- Cater for the wide range of activities in which students are expected to participate;
- Allow students to feel comfortable in the North Queensland climate;
- Meet Work, Health and Safety Policy requirements.

Wearing the School uniform is compulsory and reflected through parents and families supporting the values of the school by ensuring their child's uniform is worn correctly and with pride.

The policy also applies to personal appearance items, including hairstyles, jewellery, make-up and nails.
