






RMO Recruitment in QH

- Annual state-wide recruitment campaign JHOs SHOs PHOs Registrars
- Centralised e-Recruitment system:
 - Same system for intern recruitment
 - Cost efficiencies
 - Eliminates need for multiple applications across HHS
 - Streamlines selection and appointment of junior doctors
- Individual HHS merit selection processes



Hospital facilities

Mount isa is a CSCF Level 4 Specialist Service Base Hospital with a total of 80 beds. It is the referral hospital for the North West region, with remote country/community hospitals at Doomadgee, Normanton, Mornington Island, Cloncurry, Julia Creek and health centres at Dajarra, Camooweal, Karumba and Burketown.

Mount isa also has a Royal Flying Doctor Service base providing rural retrievals, transfers and numerous primary health care activities including clinics at the health centres mentioned above. Mount isa Hospital has undergone a redevelopment which included a new Emergency Department, new Outpatients Department, Mental Health (Outpatient) Unit and Cancer Care Centre. The Paediatrics Unit is currently under

The Emergency Department sees approximately 28,000 to 30,000 presentations per annum. An extremely varied mix of presentations gives clinical staff many opportunities to gain hands-on experience in procedural work and broad clinical experience. Our hospital is the major referral centre for nine other remote health facilities and clinics in the region. Therefore our health facility is the primary facility for the treatment of trauma caused by mining and farming accidents as well as road accidents. Medical staff will be exposed to a variety of medical, surgical, gynaecological and paediatric cases.





Completing your application form

- Complete all steps of online form and submit prior to closing date
- Upload mandatory documentation
 - Medical degree, MBA Registration, resume, VPDs, proof of identification
 - IMGs/OTDs will need to supply visa documentation, VEVO entitlements check, AMC MCQ or AMC cert if applicable
- Check and update any documents that were pre-populated from last years application (if applicable)



Completing your application form

- Nominate 2 referees
 - Ensure you enter correct details
 - System confirmation email when reports returned
 - You must follow up outstanding reports
 - Consider referee options early



Completing your application form

- Nominate up to 5 preferences on application form (location and positions)
 - Available position search on website
 - Check for additional application requirements
- Contact individual hospital(s) regarding:
 - Position information
 - Selection processes
 - Selection outcomes


Specialty training programs

In Queensland, specialist medical trainees can be allocated to a training position via three separate avenues:

- 1. a centrally managed Queensland Health pathway, network or training program
- 2. directly by a Queensland Health facility accredited for training; or
- 3. an individual specialist medical college, which allocates trainees to a Queensland facility

Review your discipline's webpage for information regarding eligibility, recruitment processes, important dates, and other specific requirements needed to acquire a training position. All candidates irrespective of their training program must apply via the RMO campaign applicant portal and be registered (or plan to register) with the relevant specialist medical college.
