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History

Our Lady Help of Christians School was established in 1964 at the request of Bishop Cahill of Cairns, who invited the Sisters of Mercy to open a school in the growing southern region of Cairns, now known as Earlville. Led by founding Principal Sr Mary Consilla Wallwork, with Sr Rovena Duffy serving as the final Sister Principal in 1978, the school opened on 28 January with 51 students from Years One to Four.

Originally housed in the old administration building, which also served as the Parish Church, the school gradually expanded, becoming co-educational from Years One to Seven in 1984, with a Preschool added in 1994. Over the decades, the school has undergone significant development, including full air-conditioning in the mid-1990s, and now offers modern facilities that support contemporary learning.

Throughout these years, the Parish made substantial financial contributions to ensure high-quality buildings and educational environments, despite challenges along the way. Our school was founded in the Mercy tradition and continues to be inspired by the Gospel, nurturing learners who are spiritually, socially and ecologically aware, and who are called to live with a 'heart of mercy.'

We are proud to bear the name of Mary, Our Lady Help of Christians, a title that emerged in the early 1800s as a call for her intercession and protection in times of hardship. We acknowledge the Gimuy Walaburra Yidinji people as the Traditional Owners of the land on which our school and Parish stand, and we are grateful for their sharing of the Gindaja story of the Bukal region and their enduring spiritual connection to Country.

- **Regular attendance** is essential if pupils are to gain the greatest possible benefit from school activities.
- **Student absences must be notified** by the parent/carer, preferably via the **MyCE app** or email.
- **Parents or carers** are responsible for informing the school immediately with a reason for the student's absence.
- **It is necessary that every absence is notified** before 9:00am.
- **If you receive an SMS** notifying you of your child's absence, please respond as soon as possible with the reason for the absence.
- **Request for Leave** forms must be submitted and approved by the principal for leave periods of one week or more.
- **Medical certificates must be provided** for 2 or more days of absence.

Prep Transition Program

At Our Lady Help of Christians School, we are committed to supporting a smooth and positive start to school life through our Prep Orientation and Transition Programs, which begin in Term 4 of the year prior to students commencing Prep.

Our program is designed around key elements of effective transition practice, ensuring that:

- Transition to school is a core part of our school's approach.
- We are well-prepared to welcome both children and their families.
- Strong, respectful relationships are built between students, parents, and staff.
- Communication and collaboration are prioritised across all stakeholders.
- Dedicated resources support every step of the journey.
- The transition is guided by a thoughtful and well-planned approach.

Through these programs, we aim to:

- Provide a smoother entry into the school environment.
- Foster positive connections between children, families, and our school community;

Maintain ongoing professional links with early childhood services and relevant agencies.



Arrival & Departure

- **Students should arrive** at school by 8:05am.
- **Late arrivals** - Students arriving after the 8.15am **MUST** enter via the front office and sign in before heading to the classroom. **Only students** are allowed past the office after 8:15am.
- **Early Departures** - Students leaving school early due to appointments or illness must be signed out by a parent/carer and collected from the office.
- **Please make sure** your student/s are collected on time.
- **Designated pick up** areas are Stop, Drop, Go on Balaclava Road and Mestrez Street.
- **The Staff and Parish** car park **should not** be used for dropping off and picking up students at school.
- **Families who may** experience difficulty with the pick-up times can enrol with Outside School Hours Care (OSHC).

Stop, Drop & Go

- **Stop, Drop & Go zones** are located on Balaclava Rd and Mestrez St - **the preferred zone is Mestrez St.**
- **There are rules** that apply to the Stop, Drop & Go Zones to ensure a smooth transition at drop off and pick up.
- **Safety is a Priority - Patience is Necessary.**
- **Please keep moving forward** in the queue before allowing child/ren to exit/enter the vehicle.
- **Drivers do not get out of the vehicle.**
- **It is preferable not to have school bags in the boot of the vehicle,** as it can pose a risk when a child needs to open the back of the vehicle.
- At pick up time, your child's name will be called out when you are at the front of the queue.

Uniforms (See page 28 for more details)

Uniforms are purchased from Uniform Link 2A/110 Scott St, Bungalow, 07 4032 4918. It is expected that all parents will support the school's requirement that full and correct uniforms be worn at all times. Any deviation from this should be explained, in writing, to the class teacher.

School backpacks and library bags are purchased at the school office. (See page 28)

All clothing should be clearly marked with the student's name.

Shoes: Plain black Joggers with black laces or velcro must be worn with both formal and sport uniforms. NO high-tops, coloured trim, or logos allowed.

Socks: Navy blue crew socks, **must be visible above shoes.**

Hats: School bucket hat - Compulsory - **No Hat No Play.**

Jackets: School jackets are available at Uniform Link. **(No other jackets should be worn.)**

Hair: Collar-length hair or longer must be tied back; ribbons should be navy blue, white or made from the uniform check. NO undercut, tracks, lines, colours or tints.

Jewellery: One pair of plain gold or silver sleepers/studs – ears only. One chain with a religious medal/cross is permitted; no rings are allowed.

Makeup and nail polish are **not** permitted.

Formal Uniform

Shirt: Unisex checked shirt.

Shorts: Unisex shorts or skort.

Sport Uniform

Shirt: School sports shirt (Sports House coloured polo shirts can be worn for annual sporting events). Long-sleeved school Polo Shirts are optional.

Shorts: Unisex shorts or skort.

A sports uniform may be worn only on the days when the class has PE and annual sporting events.

Outside of School Hours Care - OSHC

Care services: Before School, After School, Vacation

Our Lady Help of Christians School Outside School Hours Care philosophy is guided by children's families and educators' input, ideas and values. Our philosophy, like our program, fosters children's wellbeing, learning and development through play and recreation.

OSHC is located at the rear of the school on Mestrez Street. Our service provides the opportunity for children to take calculated risks and further build their knowledge and skills. We believe in seeing the whole person and that mind, body and spirit are of equal importance.

Medication and First Aid:

Medication: If your child is required to take medication at school, a Medication Permission Form needs to be completed and signed. All medication is to be labelled with the child's name and dosage instructions.

First Aid is provided at the school for minor incidents; parents will be contacted if necessary. In the case of emergencies, an ambulance will be called.

Important Information:

Blue Cards: See volunteering.

Emergency Contact Information must be kept up to date at all times. Students are not allowed to leave the school grounds with anyone who is not listed as an emergency contact, unless written permission is provided. Details can be updated via the MyCE App or by emailing: secretary@cns.catholic.edu.au

Excursions, incursions, and school camps are important for learning and socialising and are part of the school program. Permission slips must be completed before a student can attend. School camps are limited to Year 6 students only (from 2026).

Extra-curricular activities are available before and after school, as well as at break times. Please ask for more information.

Fees & Levies are invoiced at the beginning of each term. Invoices are due for payment within 14 days of the statement date. For more details, visit the website or email: accounts@cns.catholic.edu.au

Gates open at 7:45am-8:15am, and at the end of the school day at 2:25pm-2:45pm.

Hats are to be worn outside at all times; no hat, no play.

Leaving school grounds is not permitted during school hours unless accompanied by a parent or carer, and student/s must be signed out at the office before leaving.

The School **Library** is available to students from 7:45am, before the first bell. Borrowing facilities are available to students. Loans are limited to two weeks; students are required to have a school library bag to protect books in transit.

Important Information Continued:

Lost Property can be found in a caged cupboard outside the administration office. Please name & label all items of clothing, bags, water bottles, hats, etc.

Lunch boxes need to contain an ice brick to keep food chilled. Prep & Year 1 students enjoy a fruit break mid-morning. Please pack a piece of fruit.

Media Consent forms are completed at the time of enrolment and can be updated at any time by submitting an updated form to the office. Students without media consent will be excluded from all school photography and videography, except for Student ID photos.

Mobile Phones are not permitted in class and are not to be used during school hours. The school phones are to be used if needed.

MyCE App - This application allows you to lodge absences and access all relevant information, including academic reports, the school calendar, newsletters, and term dates.

NAPLAN - National Assessment Program Language & Numeracy occurs in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9.

Newsletters are published in odd weeks of the school term.

Office hours are Mon - Fri 7:45am - 4:00pm. Occasionally, the office will close early for a meeting, and correspondence will be sent out accordingly. The school & office close at 12:00pm on the last day of the school year.

Parent-Teacher Interviews are held in Terms 1 and 3. Appointments are made via the Booked platform.

Important Information Continued:

P&F Association welcomes involvement from all families and the school community. General meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month in the STEM lab.

The meetings are quick and efficient, and pizza and refreshments are available. The P&F coordinates several events per year, including Community Breakfasts, Mother's and Father's Day activities, School discos, and support for catering at the annual Christmas Carols Evening.

Permission slips are required for excursions, excursions, and various school activities. It is imperative that permissions are granted to allow students to participate. Please always review correspondence from the school and respond promptly.

Pick up time is 2:30pm; please arrive on time. If you are late due to an emergency, please contact the office immediately. Please enrol your child/children at OSCH if you are unable to collect students on time.

Sports houses are **McSweeny (Gold)** **McKenna (Red)** **McAuley (Blue)** & **MacKillop (Green)**.

Staff & Parish car parks are for staff and parishioners only. They are not to be used for picking up and dropping off students.

Student Academic Reports are available at the end of Terms 2 and 4 via The Learning Dashboard; reports can be downloaded from the MyCE app.

Student Leadership comprises School Captains, Sports Captains, Mercy Workers and the Student Representative Council (SRC).

Important Information Continued:

Student Representative Council (SRC) serves as a voice for the student body, allowing it to convey concerns and ideas to the Leadership Team.

Treasures, toys & sports equipment are best left at home to keep them safe.

Tuckshop is available for morning tea and lunch, Monday to Friday. Orders are to be submitted before 7:45am.

The Flexischool App is the most convenient ordering platform.

Values are **Respect, Love, Mercy** and **Community**.

Volunteering at the school is a great way to be a part of the school community. All volunteers are required to complete the online mandatory training annually before volunteering. It is recommended to do this at the beginning of each school year.

Blue Cards are required for all volunteers, except for legal guardians. However, new legislation stipulates that legal guardians must hold a Blue Card if an activity requires a sleepover, such as a school camp.

Water Bottles can be refilled at school from the water coolers placed around the school grounds.

Uniforms are available from Uniform Link. Backpacks and library bags are available from the school. The uniform policy is to be adhered to at all times. See page 15 & 28 for more information.

Illness

When to Keep Your Child at Home

Children must stay home if they have:

- Fever of 38° or higher (must be fever-free for 24 hours without medication to return).
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Unexplained rash, pink eye, or contagious illness.
- Persistent cough, difficulty breathing, or flu-like symptoms.

If your child is absent for 2+ days due to illness, a medical certificate is required.

Medication Policy

Prescription medications require a Medication Permission Form to be completed

All medication must be in its original packaging and handed into school at the reception

No medication (including cough drops) should be left in a child's backpack

Food & Allergy

Allergy & Food Safety Guidelines

Students are encouraged not to share their food.

Parents must disclose food allergies or dietary restrictions during enrolment.

EpiPens and inhalers must be provided by parents if needed. Please see instructions above.

A number of staff are trained in EpiPen administration and allergy response.



Home-Packed Morning Tea & Lunch

- Lunch should be healthy and balanced, avoiding sugary snacks and soft drinks

Foods Not Allowed
