On 28 October 2017, the Government announced a proposed Global Tourism Hub (GTH) for Tropical North Queensland, to offer dynamic opportunities for Queensland and to deliver and enhance its tourism offerings for locals and visitors alike.

A GTH may include some of the following offerings; 5 or 6 star international hotels, cultural and entertainment precincts, restaurants and bars, meeting and conference

facilities, apartments, integrated resorts including casinos and gaming facilities, boutique retail, green space and public realm.

GTHs bring a plethora of opportunities and benefits for the broader community, including regional jobs, investment and flow-on developments with an end goal to grow the State's \$25 billion tourism industry.
