In year 11 students have the following subject options to select from:

Senior Subject Options	Description
Study of Religion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finish Religion & Ethics in Year 10 with Unit 1. • Select Study of Religion in senior.
Religion and Ethics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue with Religion and Ethics for Years 11 and 12 completing all 4 units.
Catholic Faith in Action	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete Religion & Ethics Unit 2 in Semester 1 of year 11. • Select CFiA for remaining 3 semesters of senior study.

The Catholic schools of the Diocese have developed a course of study which offers quality Catholic education. The program is integrated and underpinned by Christian teachings including scripture, Catholic anthropology, social justice, ethics, morality, prayer and worship.

The development and delivery of Catholic Faith in Action has been informed by a set of guiding principles which include being outward looking, making meaning, engaging in dialogue, integration, subsidiarity, collaboration and student choice.

Over the course, commencing in semester 2 of year 11, the graduate expectations from this subject are:

- *A discerning pilgrim formed in the Catholic faith community who experiences the signs and sacred mystery of God's presence.*
- *An effective communicator who speaks, writes, and listens attentively and sensitively, responding critically in light of a Catholic perspective*
- *A creative and critical thinker who solves problems and makes responsible decisions with an informed moral conscience for the common good.*
- *A self-directed, responsible, lifelong learner who develops and demonstrates God-given potential*
- *A collaborative contributor who finds meaning dignity and purpose in work and life which respects the rights of all and contributes to the common good.*

This subject contains four overarching profound questions which are investigated and studied in Years 11 and 12.

Through a range of tasks, reflection and journaling students are offered the opportunity to meet the graduate expectations through their study of the profound questions.
