

Religion and Ethics

Religion & Ethics focuses on the personal, relational and spiritual perspectives of human experience. Students investigate and critically reflect on the role and function of religion and ethics in society

In studying Religion & Ethics, students will learn about:

- Who am I (the personal perspective)?
- Who are we (the relational perspective)?
- Is there more than this (the spiritual perspective)?

Students will complete the following assessments:

- project
- investigation
- extended response
- examination.

Students commence their study of Religion and Ethics in year 10 and complete Units 1 and 2 over an 18-month period. In year 11 students have the following subject options to select from:

Religion and Ethics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue with Religion and Ethics for Years 11 and 12 completing all 4 units.
Catholic Faith in Action	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete Religion & Ethics Unit 2 in Semester 1 of year 11. • Select CFiA for remaining 3 semesters of senior study.
