



## Study of Religion

In year 11 students have the following subject options to select from:

Study of Religion investigates religious traditions and how religion has influenced, and continues to influence, people's lives. Students become aware of their own religious beliefs, the religious beliefs of others, and how people holding such beliefs can co-exist in a pluralist society.

In undertaking Study of Religion, students will learn about a variety of viewpoints based on major world religions with respect to:

- investigation — inquiry response (25%)
- examination — short response (25%).
