SECTION 2: REPORTS

PRESIDENT'S REPORT – JOSH WEST

2022 has been my first year as president of the Townsville Hockey Association and I would like to start with thanking all the members of Townsville Hockey for their support and encouragement throughout what I believe has been an extremely successful year.

The strongest sentiments I feel from this year are resilience and community. THA is a community like no other as we cater equally and inclusively for men and women, with members ranging in age from 5 to 75. Overwhelmingly though, we are a community focussed association with multiple generations of the same families playing at all levels through the competition.

You cannot have success without hard work, I would like to formally thank the Board of Management, all the players/coaches/managers, our hardworking officials, THA staff and most of all the volunteers.

Townsville Hockey Association has a fantastic and hardworking staff and I want to thank Christine, Kylie, Nathan, and Peter your effort as both staff and volunteers you all continually do your best to provide a great playing and family environment.

Within our Association some members go above and beyond regularly to coordinate, manage and assist - thank you to Mark Fenlon (judiciary) Bruce Astbury (BOM secretary), Rob and Nikki Lewis (umpire academy and officiating), Anne Jones (umpire coordinator), Bill Osborne, Brian Kershaw, Glen Maidment (facilities)

As an association we are unable to survive and prosper without the generous assistance of all our sponsors, However the Maidment groups continued support and contribution to THA and the THA facility requires special mention. The considerable support of the Maidment group has been critical to the success and growth of hockey in Townsville.

In 2022 we have increased registered player numbers by 91. This is on top of the increases during the 2021 and 2020 season, effectively rendering the double impacts of the floods in 2019 and Covid 19 in 2020 to just a memory.

However, it is important to consider the past when looking to the future, Townsville Hockey Association proven to be resilient, cohesive, and progressive, the standout for THA is community, our association is a

community and when needed this community sprit rises to meet any challenge. This will be needed in coming years as the volunteering and giving back will become critical to the success of our sport.

I have been a member of the THA board for 5 years, and it would be remiss of me to not acknowledge and thank all the past board members and the immediate past president Annette Maidment. Over the previous 5 years the BOM, restructured the Board and many of our business operations. Annette certainly left association in a better place than she found it.

SEASON 2022:

Player growth in 2022 necessitated the introduction of competition matches on Sundays. Another change in 2022 was the introduction of 4 mixed masters teams to complement our existing 4 team mens master's competition on Tuesday nights.

THA has involvement and programs in over 50% of the schools in Townsville this is a massive feeder for young players and will be built on in 2023.

2022 saw a total of 86 teams across 15 divisions comprising -

- Mini sticks
- 25 junior teams
- 39 senior teams
- 8 masters teams
- 8 J league teams

The THA Mini Sticks program again provided our youngest players an introduction to hockey and continues to be the leader for our recruitment. 2023 will again see MST return and it is the hope of the Board that renewed interest is demonstration from all clubs, remembering one of the key features of the minis sticks model is the ability to balance recruitment and keep steady and consistent numbers equally divided between our 4 clubs.

2022 saw the implementation of the Premier Preseason Challenge (PPC) for our D1 ladies and men, the competition was non-club based with 4 teams in each mens and ladies competing. The 4 teams were selected equally to provide close competition and coaches were appointed by THA making this new competition a first for THA, planning is underway to expand the competition in 2023 to add a J League PPC competition. Following on from this our championship season commenced in March and was completed on September 10 with junior and senior grand final. The return to combined junior and senior finals on the same day saw a full day of grand finals with very close results and numerous shoot outs to decide divisions.

Our summer social competition has commenced with 40 teams registered across senior, corporate, and junior competitions, this is an increase of another 4 teams from 2021, the competition is proving to be a continued success from the 2018 season with 13 teams competing.

THA is still unable to find a suitable venue for a full-time indoor hockey competition. 2022 will have THA sides competing in HQ indoor state championships and we will be running trials and preparation from the upper ross PCYC. THA will continue to advocate for Indoor Hockey in an effort to return to indoor hockey to the off-season calendar in the future.

REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS:

Firstly, a special Thank you to all the parents, coaches and managers that make it possible for all our players to attend Hockey Queensland (HQ) state championships, Hawthorn Shield, and the Mackay Hockey Festival.

2022 saw Townsville Hockey Association represented in the following -

- Hawthorne Shield (from U11 to masters)
- U11 Mackay Hockey Festival 6 teams (3 girls and 3 boys)
- U13 HQ state championships 4 teams (2 girls, HQ championships in Ipswich. 2 Boys HQ championships in Gladstone)
- U15 HQ state championships 3 teams (2 girls, HQ championships in Maryborough. 1 Boys HQ championships in Mackay)
- U18 HQ state championships 2 teams (1 girls, HQ championships in Gold Coast. 1 Boys HQ championships in Brisbane)
- Open HQ state championships 2 teams (1 Ladies and 1 mens HQ championships in Brisbane)
- Masters mens O34+ and O50+ HQ championships in Rockhampton
- Masters mens O60+ HQ championships in Sunshine Coast
- Masters ladies O34 to O70+ HQ championships in Townsville

The results of the state championships are included in the back of this annual report.

Continuing from 2021 the inclusion of the Open HQ state championships is critical for the development of senior players in regional associations, THA hopes this will continue well into the future.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS HOSTED:

2022 saw Townsville Hockey host the Hockey Queensland Masters Ladies State Championships with 52 teams attending, this is by far one the biggest championships we have held.

Not only was this carnival one of the biggest it was one of the best, THA recived overwhelming praise from players and other associations. Our facility is the best hockey complex in Queensland and our volunteers are as generous as they are tireless.

I would like to acknowledge the master's Ladies Organising Committee - <u>Championships Convenor</u> Gary Wicks, <u>Championships Co-ordinator</u> Peta Davis, <u>Members</u> Jamie Burton, Sue Champion, Evonne Craven, Rachel Knight, Christine O'Neill, Danyell Sharp, without your hard work and drive our carnival would not have been the success it was.

I would like to make special acknowledgement of Jeremy Steel, Kylie Dixon, Chris Bourke, Bill Osbourne, Ty Bullen, Peter Edwards, and Nathan Doherty, the hours worked during the preparation and over the carnival weekend were astounding.

In 2023 THA is looking forward to hosting the U18 mens and Masters mens O60 State Championships.

REFLECTION AND LOOKING FORWARD

As mentioned earlier, 2022 saw a strong increase in player numbers, however we as an association need to increase our efforts in recruitment and player retention. It is imperative that THA work with clubs to continually improve the overall hockey experience as families look to tighten their discretionary spending due to rising costs of living. All parties involved in the sport, being they direct participants, parents watching on or sponsors of the association, need to feel valued and included to ensure they return the following season.

The THA facility is without doubt first class, and with a stable management structure and financial base in 2022 we need to enter 2023 with great optimism. Continued focus on -

- 1. Strong working relationships with all four clubs as their financial viability relies on the Association's strength
- 2. Greater club buy-in and support for Ministicks through the provision of volunteer coaches, coordinators or just helpers to set up or pack away sessions.
- 3. Continued and stronger involvement in schools with the Brisbane Olympics being only 10 years away. The time for hockey to gain traction against non-Olympic sports (ie League and AFL) for participant numbers is now.

In closing -

I encourage our members, parents, and friends to lend a hand in 2023, hockey has many roles both big and small that make a difference, it is a great way to be a part of our community and can be very rewarding.

HOCKEY PARTICIPATION REPORT – HOPE PHILIP

After my first year within the role of Participation Director, it is exciting to see the growth and development of players within the region across the 12-month period.

While all physical activity provides significant benefits, hockey is providing stronger outcomes including, improved resilience, promoting health and wellbeing, building confidence, and helping maintain mental health.

Hockey as a sport reflects real life: There is competition, teamwork, victory, loss, conflict, and resolution. Not only are these factors important but in 2022 has seen significant growth in the Townsville Hockey Association social participation framework. This includes Social Mixed Masters and more teams participating at club level based on recruitment and returning of players to the sport.

With only 4 clubs within the Townsville Hockey Association framework, it is imperative that all clubs are working on increasing their membership numbers by nurturing the current player base, recruiting new players from social networks, workplaces, schools, and other sporting codes. In order to continue growth and competition levels there must be sufficient members to support and develop the sport across the region.

Dependent upon the grades and division of males and females, there are some clubs that are showing less recruitment, on one or both sides. In order to ensure that numbers are stable and increasing, it may be worthwhile more contact is made in the off season with the current base but also with previous members on their potential return to the sport. It is clear and evident that those that 'chase' their players earlier prior to the preseason commencing are standing stronger in the means of participation numbers across the grades. It also allows them to identify early what assistance they may need with this but also leads them towards having a 'sport marketing plan' in order to boost recruitment. This is an area that clubs could be developing in the playing season ready for their off season.

Along with participation of members there is also the participation need of volunteers in the roles of coach, manager, assistant coach, technical official & umpires. The development of resources to assist coaches that may not have a lot of experience is something that needs to be introduced from both a club and association conjoined effort. This will allow participation to be inclusive, fun, educational and allowing the players across ALL divisions and grades to be developing and ultimately returning to the sport on a weekly and yearly basis.

FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS WITHIN PARTICIPATION

- Increased club involvement with mini sticks.
- Attract and retain more 11–17-year-old players.
- Continue to transition more mini sticks players to the U10 competition.
- Identify more junior goalkeepers.
- Monitor and guide clubs that are needing to strengthen numbers for both juniors and seniors.
- Introduce a new Kookaroos Schools Program in 2023 targeted towards interest rather than volume delivery
- Continue to seek suitable long term indoor hockey venue, allowing an indoor program and competitions for 2023.
- Townsville Hockey Association would benefit from the hire of a part time development officer (20hpw) to take lead on schools' development, junior club support and school holiday programs. Funding would need to be sought for this.

2022 was a fantastic following season of hockey, with expansion in our competitions involving players from Under 10 to Masters. We continued the 2022 season with our third year of mixed junior divisional hockey and the third season of the franchise-based J league competition for players aged 15-19 years. Our senior's competition continued to grow with the addition of six senior teams from 2021 season, expanding our D3 & D4 Men's and Ladies competitions. We introduced a Mixed Masters competition this year, which was a great success. This provided an opportunity to all members to still play our sport, while making our Masters Men's +34 competition more competitive based.

So, what is needed in 2023 moving forward:

- Lights to be installed on Brothers fields (pending on grants and communication with THA)
- Recycle water to be connected to complex by Townsville City Council. (This is ongoing as TCC is a long way off making this happen. Anna Wheelan is the engineer for TCC)

- Top dress fields and fertilise.
- Maintenance plan moving forward
- Sinking fund to be ongoing so we are in a position in 9-10 years to replace carpet again.
- Shade, shade, and more shade. We are chasing grants and contacts to make this happen.

LONG TERM WISH LIST/PLAN FACILITIES TOWNSVILLE HOCKEY

- Shade in front of clubhouse and on hills for both turf fields. (Continue to apply for grants for this)
- Elite Athletes training facility (access to the Sports reserve facilities for this as well)
- Indoor hockey facility
- Cement pathway around Billabong field
- Large Game clocks for grass fields + wifi.
- Lighting on all grass fields
- Covered in training goal boxes area for temp. dugouts and seating. Make sure uhf radios are charged for two tech officials to keep in touch.
- Tech boxes and dugouts for grass fields near halfway line in between fields.
- Infrastructure upgrades to include viewing platforms
- Portable dugouts
- Stormwater management
- Placement of old red rooster outlet
- Gaining access to second hand shade sails from private school and putting them up
- Raising middle flagpole for flags
- Getting framing for two water hole end curly bells and getting donated insulated roofs.
- Move old curly bells to roadside of waterhole.

I personally would like to thank all board members of THA for their continued time and effort in making what we have, even better. Moving forward, there have been some significant changes as the numbers of our members continue to grow. As we move into 2023, I think we can be proud in what we have accomplished and the ratings we receive from tournaments. Congratulations.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT – GARY KERSHAW

The 2022 Development Report is presented for review at the THA Annual Meeting and by BOM and members.

Lasts years report proposed the THA Board, officials and clubs have a "hockey development focus and agenda" with the development aspect being taken in the broadest sense. The focus to be to

- Fully utilise and appreciate the high standard of facilities
- Fully engage with and encourage players and clubs to interact positively and cooperatively
- Provide resources to THA support staff and our RCD to take hockey development forward
- Engage via links from and to Hockey Qld and Hockey Australia to support our actions
- Develop our HQ championships credentials
- Develop our reputation for playing coaching and administration of hockey

In many ways these things have commenced however for others enhancement is needed- and improvement is always possible.

I congratulate Josh West for the time, effort, and direction he has provided, including "Developing Hockey" as a key element and focus of the THA BOM agenda in his first year as president.

I thank fellow board members for their efforts in individual portfolios and the collaborations between the group aimed at providing a better experience to our clubs and members

Development Direction and Future

What now for development: In a nutshell - more work, more people, and better, consistent outcomes!

To achieve THA development outcomes more consistently will require regular critical review of "the good; the bad and the ugly" from recent years

(What development objectives from 2021-22 were achieved, rejected, or require work, enhancement or evolution)

With this information and regular feedback, an agreed reset of the key targets and detailed objectives for 2023-2026 established.

Set specific goals and activities for 2023, some of these to be

- 1. Lock-in the known schedule player coach and officiating actions and activities
- 2. Confirm the resources required or lacking toe enable delivery of the 2023 schedule
- 3. Identify the structure for managing and developing the development agenda in 2023 and beyond
- 4. Build an annual scheduled which integrates with the Competitions schedule <u>and</u> the HQ championship schedule, opportunities to align player coach and officiating development
- 5. Identifies the development pathways for
 - a. Players, coaches, and officials over time.
 - b. New & club; player, coach and officials' development
 - c. Identifying Advanced: Player, Coach, and Official pathways
 - d. A nuanced / tailored set of plans for the different groups in the development sights Juniors / Juniors to Seniors/ Seniors and masters players; coaches and officials.
- 6. Annualised set of basic development activities scheduled across the year interactive with competition planning

For the RCD to deliver an integrated development agenda will require

- Consistent and effective leadership from the BOM Integrated planning and goals across the
 activities and events of the hockey year
- Increased interaction and support from clubs communication and buy in
- Appropriate volunteer numbers and Skills -working smarter / delegation of actions
- Effective communication with the member base and the target groups for development activities
- An operational approach to delivery of longer-term development objectives with identified milestones for improvements over a 1–5-year cycle.
- Alignment between participation, recruitment, development, and competitions for each of the three key development groups Players, Coaches and Officials
- Plan for interactive THA Rep team development integrated into the calendar

Development structure to be fully realised and imbedded in the operations of THA including

- 1. An active strategic Oversight panel -
- 2. A formal junior development panel with
 - a. active integration with Junior competitions
 - b. consistent calendar of annual activities and programs
- 3. Consolidate the re-emergence of a senior representative program
- 4. Finalise a consistent coach development program with clubs
- 5. Consolidate the Officiating Academy
- 6. Socialise and enhance the pathways for players, coaches, and officials

RCD Role Potential

The RCD requires a larger group of people and skills to accelerate the development cycle, to enable

the RCD, to balance, on the ground coaching actions / activities and managing a broader and larger agenda involving more volunteers to deliver a substantial development program.

Specifically, for the hockey development, the focus to be, forward thinking in the age of a "new normal" post the disruptions of the past few years.

The RCD is critically placed to deliver in this area however it is predicated on

- Enhance leadership skills to be more affective
- Increased interaction, communication and support and contacts with THA BOM and clubs
- Increased volunteer numbers -working smarter
- A THA coordinated communication plan to reach members consistently and effectively

Nathan has met consistently with me and Josh West over the year past on a wide range of ideas, issues, and plans to confirm the focus and priorities for his action. Nathan continues to develop his engagement with club coaches and officials, and this will be a focus for 2023.

These interactions across the year have seen the development program we have had in 2022 some of it as planned, parts adapted and some not able to be achieved.

Nathan's tenure in the RCD role allows him to be cognisant of the effort, support and roadblocks to be negotiated and with that an awareness that his approach to the RCD role must adapt and grow. Specifically in 2023 to the confirm the priorities and consider resource capability and options he has to deliver the anticipated outcomes and range expectations across THA members.

Clubs

2022 saw meetings with the club in Feb / march to develop closer links and whilst these discussions were fruitful, to increase the effectiveness the process will be developed further for 2023 and discussion to be held earlier to enable expansion and coordination of the action to occur

Officiating

Thanks goes again to Ann Jones for her role of coordinating THA officials, though 2022.

Specific thanks to key members in Anne's team and particularly to Paula Grover-Johnson for her drive and involvement which traversed Junior, Senior and Master hockey in 2022. Paula is leaving Townsville and will leave a significant gap to fill.

This year has tested Ann and her team, as the level of effort required to deliver week to week officiating to THA has been on display without the necessary focus from all to solve the problem rather than reiterate it.

A concerted effort is required from THA and clubs and importantly key individuals in each club to obtain the numbers, programs, and model to be more self-sustaining year on year.

Development beyond the current THA player base.

Further actions to have more engagement in our school program is critical to development and player base.

A THA planned and focussed Schools and community marketing of hockey, raise our profile.

Access to people and resources (a pool of development coaches) is instrumental to expanding our school programs

Representative honours

The representative season highlighted the range in the depth charts of playing, officiating and coaching capability and skills THA has across the age, gender groups participating for representative honours.

As always, all teams performed to their best and represented Townsville with honour and a number of individuals were selected for higher representative honours. The board report details the achievements of THA teams in 2022.

As with all years we should reflect on the development aspects which will enable our hockey development focus to provide all players with consistent capability and skills to compete and enjoy their representative opportunities. Feedback has been obtained to learn and develop our programs as we move forward.

Summary

The transition to a full-blown focus on hockey development, took baby steps in 2022 and will need 2023 to see further progress of detailed operational actions to shift the momentum and accelerate improvement to attain the outcomes which are desired and achievable by THA our clubs and members.


