SECTION 2: REPORTS

THA was established in 1929 by volunteers committed to the sport of hockey and happily this sentiment continues some 94 years later. To our volunteers regardless of how big or small your involvement in 2023, I cannot thank you enough.

In 2023 we had 2 notable changes to the Board, with Bruce Astbury (secretary) Kylie Dixon (treasurer) retiring, after having served 6 years as Board members (maximum term under the constitution).

I would like to thank Kylie and Bruce and acknowledge the hard work and time commitment you have both dedicated to Townsville Hockey.

Kylie joined the BOM during a difficult time for the business and as a key member of the Board, has been instrumental in leading us to the positive financial position we are in today.

Bruce was a key driver of the current Board structure. Having volunteered for many years before and during his tenure as Secretary his leadership and council has been invaluable.

Townsville Hockey also has a small and dedicated staff I would like to acknowledge our THA staff Kylie, Rhylee, Christine, and Peter. It is noteworthy to acknowledge the additional time that all our staff volunteer to hockey on weekends and afterhours, this dedication to our association goes a long way.

At the end of 2022 our Regional Coaching Director – Nathan Doherty made the decision to peruse a career change, we thank Nathan for the years of service and positive change at THA.

Nathan leaving was the catalyst for an international recruitment drive for our RCD employment committee, made up of Gary Kershaw, Murray James, and Josh West, who searched through dozens of applications from Australia and overseas. As a result of this rigorous process, Rhylee Pendrigh was appointed as our new RCD in February 2023.

SEASON 2023:

After much discussion with clubs and members the first change in 2023 was the removal of Sunday games from the competition. We saw a slight retraction in senior player numbers however the major driver to the change was the postponement of the U18 J league competition. The postponement of the U18 competition was due to many factors including Hockey Queensland changing the state championship calendar and moving U18 championships to within the school term in early May. THA is committed to reintroducing an U18 aged based competition in 2024.

Our season started with a sense of urgency as a result of the HQ calendar changes, as this necessitated the move forward for many of our programs. Hawthorn Shield, Open league, U18 Championships, and Masters Men were all completed by mid-May.

In 2023, the THA hockey programs saw the inclusion of

- School programs
- Mini Sticks
- Junior (up to U15)
- Senior Premier preseason challenge
- Senior championship
- Masters mens
- Mixed masters
- Indoor

- Casual mixed masters
- Summer hockey

Full details of THA programs and participation are included in the participation directors report.

It is no secret we have a gender imbalance across our clubs in various age divisions. In 2023, a working group was formed involving the 4 clubs and key stakeholders to revise the delivery of our junior competition season. The result was a reformatted competition based on ability and suitability not just age. This 15 and under <u>club based</u>, graded "J league" format has proven successful for 2023 and will be reviewed for 2024.

After our busy start to the year, our championship season hit off, with very close competition across all divisions. In addition to our championship season THA hosted the Hockey Queensland U18 boys and O60 Men's carnivals.

The 2023 grand final was completed on September 9 with a combined junior and senior grand final day.

Our summer social competitions have commenced with Summer Hockey (36 teams) and Casual Mixed Masters (around 30 participants) commencing for 2023, the social programs are a great part of the THA programs.

2023 has also seen the recommencement of a THA indoor competition hosted at PCYC. The 2023 season sees 8 senior and 8 junior teams competing in men's and ladies' competitions. THA will again nominate teams in 2023 to compete in HQ indoor state championships.

THA will continue work to grow social and indoor hockey programs and support the current competitions with the goal to continued growth into 2024.

REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS:

2023 saw changes to the Hockey Queensland Championship calendar and junior divisions, while some of the changes did not benefit our members all changes and challenges were met with typical THA resilience and perseverance.

The THA representative program is a huge part of the association and provides opportunities for members to participate in state championships and carnivals across men's and ladies and junior age groups.

This program is run by volunteers, and I want to thank all the parents, selectors, coaches, managers, and ball collectors involved.

Townsville Hockey Association represented in the following 2023 carnivals -

- Hawthorn Shield (from U11 to masters)
- U11 Mackay Hockey Festival 6 teams (3 girls and 3 boys)
- U13 HQ state championships 3 teams (1 girls, HQ championships Sunshine Coast. 2 Boys HQ championships Cairns)
- U15 HQ state championships 3 teams (2 girls, HQ championships Mackay. 1 Boys HQ championships Hervey Bay)
- U18 HQ state championships 4 teams (2 girls, HQ championships Cairns. 2 Boys HQ championships Townsville)
- Open HQ state championships 2 teams (1 Ladies and 1 men's HQ Championships in Brisbane)
- Masters' men's O34+ and O50+ HQ championships Brisbane
- Masters' men's O60+ HQ championships Townsville

Masters' ladies O34 to O70+ - HQ championships in Toowoomba

The results of the state championships are included in the back of this annual report.

Townsville Hockey in 2023 has again had many members included in state and national teams (list included in the rear of this report). This is a reflection of the THA development programs over many years and the professional RCD staff over the last 5 years.

Again, this cannot be achieved without volunteers willingly and generously providing their time.

REFLECTION AND LOOKING FORWARD

We started the 2023 season as the Hockey Queensland "association of the year" and I believe we have built throughout 2023 to be in a better position. The engagement and strength of our 4 clubs has been a major focus over the last 2 years ...

Townsville Hockey Association is a leader in the hockey community, and has an enviable status with -

- Extensive and professional volunteer base
- Modern well-maintained facilities
- Strong corporate governance
- Excellent financial management
- Healthy financial position

Notwithstanding this our continued focus and vigilance is needed moving forward.

- 1. School programs leading into young people playing hockey. THA needs to continue to increase participation in the U10 age bracket.
- 2. Monitor and review the current club based 15 and under J league competition, with particular attention to age group and gender balance across all 4 clubs.
- 3. Retention of older juniors and the reintroduction of an u18 competition.
- 4. Player experience and satisfaction within the senior championship season.

In 2024 I will be handing over the president's role, I want to thank the clubs and all the members of THA for the support during my time as a member of the board. It has been a privilege to serve as THA president, and I will continue to be an active volunteer and member of THA.

HOCKEY PARTICIPATION REPORT - HOPE PHILIP

Big changes were seen at Townsville Hockey in 2023, not only with competition but a transition of RCD role. Across the age groups from juniors to seniors saw people come and go and competition changes based on season registrations.

While all physical activity provides significant benefits, hockey is providing a tool of participation for stronger outcomes including, improved resilience, promoting health and wellbeing, building confidence, and helping maintain mental health.

Hockey as a sport reflects real life: There is competition, teamwork, victory, loss, conflict, and resolution. These factors are important to the participation of players and the families associated with our members.

With only 4 clubs within the Townsville Hockey Association framework, it is imperative that all clubs are working on increasing their membership numbers by nurturing the current player base, recruiting new players from social networks, workplaces, schools, and other sporting codes. To continue growth and competition levels there must be sufficient members to support and develop the sport across the region.

The decision was made by club delegates to remove the junior competition for aged and divisional based to a 'skill based' J League format. 3 divisions were introduced across the ages of 11-15 with J1, J2 & J3. This saw J1 with 4 teams, J2 with 5 teams and J3 with 7 teams. This created a bye for J2 & J3 which for 2024 it is strongly recommended for clubs to be more mindful of teams and not having a bye. The U10's competition was not affected by any changes this year and were stable with 8 teams. With the introduction of the J League U15 J League competition, it is imperative that clubs recognise and grade fairly and base these gradings on skill and not what will win a medal. It is critical that juniors are enjoying the game as many do not come back based on experience or culture.

Dependent upon the grades and division of males and females, there are some clubs that are showing less recruitment, on one or both sides. In order to ensure that numbers are stable and increasing, more contact needs to be made in the off season with the current base but also with previous members on their potential return to the sport. It is clear and evident that those that 'chase' their players earlier prior to the preseason commencing are standing stronger in the means of participation numbers across the grades. It also allows them to identify early what assistance they may need with this but also leads them towards having a 'sport marketing plan' in order to boost recruitment. This is an area that clubs could be developing in the playing season ready for their off season.

This year has seen an Indoor Competition form, with 122 registered players. With the healthy number of registrations, it has allowed a single based competition for junior boys, girls, men & women. This is currently being hosted at the Upper Ross PCYC facility at Rasmussen.

Along with participation of playing members there is also the participation need of volunteers in the roles of coach, manager, assistant coach, technical official & umpires. The development of resources to assist coaches that may not have a lot of experience is something that needs to be introduced from both a club and association conjoined effort. It cannot be relied upon for Hockey Qld to deliver these alone. This will allow participation to be inclusive, fun, educational and allowing the players across ALL divisions and grades to be developing and ultimately returning to the sport on a weekly and yearly basis.

Unfortunately dissent towards officials was discussed on many occasions with players, clubs, and officials. This behaviour is not tolerated, and club coaches and managers need to be continually leading by example to not only the players but also the spectators. This is one area that needs improvement across the board.

FURTHER DEVELOPMENTS WITHIN PARTICIPATION

- Attract and retain more 11–17-year-old players.
- Continue to transition more mini sticks players to the U10 competition.

- Identify more junior female goalkeepers from 13-17 years of age.
- Monitor and guide clubs that are needing to strengthen numbers for both juniors and seniors.
- Implement the new Hockey Australia Hook in 2 Hockey program.
- Increase school-based delivery through the terms
- Continue to build external stakeholders, schools, indoor, sponsors.
- Develop a marketing strategy

COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE REPORT – ASHLEY MCCULLOCH

2023 was another great season for Townsville Hockey competition, ranging in our players competing from Under 10 to Masters.

Juniors we continued the 2023 season with our fourth year of mixed junior divisional hockey, which we had to make some late changes due to team nominations. We know player numbers are volatile in all team sports at the moment and working with Development and Clubs we eventually landed on the 3-division basis with no specific age groups. Whilst the best outcome was potentially achieved, we need to ensure our planning and decision making is swift to give clarity to our members. Unfortunately, this year our franchise-based J league competition for players aged 15-19 years ceased due to a number of scheduling clashes including a change in timing of the U18 State Championships. This does currently leave our junior players stepping out of U15's to Senior competition only, which will continue to be reviewed.

Senior's competition grew with the addition of Division 5 Ladies competition, with all clubs nominating 5 teams. This was achieved with the same number of teams in the whole Ladies competition from 2022 and the Men's division we reduced team number by 1 in division 4 only. This year moving away from Sunday games, proved more successful for families and whilst we still had some challenges with the late Friday nighttime allocation it seemed more appropriate.

Mixed Masters Competition continued to prove a success in its second year to be something forming part of our long-term plan. Again, this Mixed Masters provided an opportunity to all members to still play our sport, while making our Masters Men's +34 competition more competitive based.

The use of RevSport to manage team lists and monitor player records and statistics enabled club officials and Competition Committee delegates to function more efficiently throughout the season. It does present some challenges to ensure clubs are operating within the competition rules and some process development needs to be considered.

Competitions committee

The Competitions Committee consisted of four (4) club delegates and myself as Chair. I would like to thank all delegates for the time and effort put in during the season and also acknowledge the operation of the committee in making decisions to ensure the best outcomes for our hockey community. Special thanks to Damian Dixon- Brothers, Grant Dale- Commercials, Peta Crichton- Parks and Amanda Cruickshank - Wests, for their commitment and time devoted to overseeing THA competitions throughout the year.

Umpires & officials

Thanks to Anne Jones for coordinating umpires throughout the season with the support of Rob Lewis for Juniors and Peta Davis for Technical Officials, this is one of the most challenging roles in THA and whilst I am sure from Anne's side was chaos, her dedicated work allowed us to run our competitions smoothly. The continued development of Technical Officials on majority of games also supports the development and growth of our association.

Prior to the commencement of the 2024 season the following main recommendations have been provided:

 - a. Competitions rules are met,

 - c. Eliminate double handling and errors.
- 2. Review and Update Competitions Procedure Manual
- 3. Continue to review Junior structure based on player numbers and ability to create a competitive game for all involved.
- 4. Review the Umpire allocation process and ensure an independent selection process is included.

<u>DEVELOPMENT REPORT – GARY KERSHAW</u>

Overview of the 2022-23 year

As my term as THA development director ends (per THA Constitution provisions) this is my final report.

I wish to thank the various THA board members, and staff I have work within my time on the Board for their contribution engagement and support.

Whilst my formal role ends, I shall retain a strong interest and commitment to hockey and particularly to Townsville Hockey. I leave with an understanding of what has been achieved:

- regular success with players, coaches, officials, teams, clubs both locally and on the larger stages,
- fantastic facilities and opportunities for our members
- committed volunteers and people who bring a wonderful diversity to the management of teams, clubs, and THA
 and into HQ

However, considerable challenges lay ahead for THA and members to address, to ensure hockey flourishes into the future. One of the more significant is, to provide development pathways which will meet expectations and desires of our whole membership is perhaps the most important.

RCD Change over 2023

Of great significance since last AGM, has been the change in RCD, with Nathan Doherty leaving THA and the arrival of Rhylee Pendrigh in February.

Firstly, I wish to thank Nathan for his contribution to the success and improvements achieved in his tenure as THA RCD and recognise his continued involvement as a volunteer member since stepping down.

Rhylee's arrival as the hockey year commenced, coupled with HQ calendar changes, presented some challenges, for both the representative program and local competitions,

I commend and thank Rhylee for her energy and capacity to take on the challenge and the and the outcomes she has achieved in her first 8-9 months.

Rhylee and I have reviewed many of the development.

Junior Programs – Recruit, Develop, Retain:

The club and THA junior programs are our pipeline to sustain a buoyant and successful association, as such it must remain, a critical, shared priorities for both THA and the four clubs.

Specifically, we must validate a shared vision and clear direction for all elements of the Junior pathways —

- Club coaching, Player development, Access to well-balanced competition structures
- managing the enjoyment, opportunity to grow as players and satisfy their competitive desires be they, club, representative, social or topflight,
- target and cater for each tier of our playing groups

2023 saw some significant challenges to balance and approach to our junior competition / development pathway — Player numbers and our gender mix across the clubs continues to require careful management and planning to develop our players to ensure our junior members have, an enjoyable introduction to our sport, such that hockey remains something they want to return to each year via systems which enable development of skills, friendship and a knowledge of the game which they can carry forward

RECOMMENDATION: To incoming BOM and Development director

THA introduce a Junior Committee with the role which includes:

- working with clubs and THA Directors in all aspects of Recruitment & Participation, Development and Competition format across a full 12 months of actions and activities.
- coordinate with the clubs they best approach to junior activities on a year-to-year basis —

- The role to extend across the full 12 months, the Winter season, Rep programs, Club needs and summer opportunities -Indoor and other programs.
- It uses evidence-based approach to plan and manage a progress program with a view beyond the existing 12-month cycle.
- Makes recommendations to Competition for appropriate competitions formats.

It considers.

- the demographics of our junior player cohorts -from Mini-Sticks/ KookaRoos to U18,
- including gender, age, and skill levels
- player loads burnout and opportunity across the skill range.

Points for resolutions/consideration

- 1. JLeague (U18) return to THA calendar in a format which supports balanced competition, development, gender based, retains balance in player loading.
- 2. Understanding and decision on the Change to HQ /HA age groups Manage to provide a positive impact on local competitions and development.
- 3. Define a match programme in the preparation for each of the THA rep teams.
- 4. Recruitment plan aligned to
- 5. Review / confirm Guidelines & processes to support junior programs.

Player Development Pathway elements & Clubs partnership

Rhylee and I have, over the year, revisited most aspects of our pathways and recommend THA reset our strategic and operational plans for Development, prioritise a focus on junior player development coordination.

The reset by both THA and clubs is to align a model based which has shared input and responsibility, one which:

- Integrates, representative and school programs.
- Partnership with each club to support both players and coaching development.
- Support balanced outcomes for each club and enhances recruitment and retention.
- Incorporates an Academy Model
 - o age / gender based.
 - o Is stratified to the age groups and genders.
- Straddles and balances activities across 12 months and includes
 - Varied forms of hockey; specialty skills, athletic and leadership skills.
 - Various formats Extended programs and Lightning programs eg Opportunities for school holiday
- Retains a focus on enjoyment and outcomes.
- Takes players from Mini sticks to HQ pathway programs

Robust structures and support to RCD

For the RCD to deliver an integrated development program requires coordination and cooperation; early detailed planning and follow up regarding outcomes.

Identify the governance and support committees and structures required to manage the development agenda for a minimum 3 years 2024-27

The RCD must also have access to

- Consistent and effective leadership from the BOM Integrated planning and goals across the activities and events of the hockey year
- Increased interaction and support from clubs communication and buy in
- Appropriate volunteer numbers and skills -working smarter / delegation of actions
- Effective communication with the member base and the target groups for development activities
- An operational approach to delivery of longer-term development objectives with identified milestones for improvements over a 3–5-year cycle.

 Alignment between participation, recruitment, development, and competitions for each of the three key development groups – Players, Coaches and Officials

Set specific goals and activities for 2024-26 to include

- 1. Plan for interactive THA 2024 calendar which integrates more holistically the THA activities including development program.
- 2. Identify clear timelines / dates for cyclical events for player coach and officiating groups:
 - a. Annualised set of basic development activities scheduled across the year
 - b. interactive with competition planning and the HQ championship schedule
 - c. Plan the availability of adequate human and physical resources required delivery the schedule
 - d. Opportunities to align the three aspects player coach and officiating development whenever possible
- 3. Includes development pathways for all demographic groups required to sustain THA & clubs
 - a. Players, coaches, and officials over time.
 - b. New & club; player, coach, and officials' development
 - c. Identifying Advanced: Player, Coach, and Official pathways
 - d. A nuanced / tailored set of plans for the different groups in the development sights -Juniors / Juniors to Seniors/ Seniors and masters players; coaches and officials.

In summary

The development job is never completed – it requires constant attention, action, and evolution to achieve the long-term outcomes so important to the future of THA and clubs.

The actions and activities must be coordinated and interactive with the operations of THA across 12 months each year.
