ST MARY'S 2022 ANNUAL SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN



ANZAC DAY ARRANGEMENTS

On Tuesday the 26th of April, our school will be hosting an ANZAC Day Prayer Service from 9:00 am -9:45 am. All parents, family, and friends are welcome to join our school in acknowledging ANZAC Day as a day when we commemorate all Australians and New Zealanders who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations.

The Bowen Community will be commemorating ANZAC Day on Monday 25 April and our school will be marching in the ANZAC Parade. We will gather as a school outside the RSL Sub-Branch in Williams Street, Bowen at 8:50 am. The march will then commence at 9.15 am to the Cenotaph atop Herbert Street. The service will be held at the Cenotaph at 9:30 am. Parents are asked to collect their children from the Cenotaph directly after the service.

All children are required to wear their full academic uniform including their wide-brimmed school hat. All parents, family, and friends are also welcome and encouraged to march with our school in this significant community event.

There will also be a dawn service at the Cenotaph in Herbert Street at 5:50 am. This year I have invited all of my Year 6 School Captains to join me in attending the dawn service. All members of our school community are also more than welcome to join us at the Dawn Service. We will be assembling at 5:30 am for a 5:50 am start. We look forward to marching along with the children for this very significant community event.



Religious Life of our School





Today we celebrated Easter with a liturgy, during which we also commissioned our 2022 Mini Vinnies. Thank you very much to Lawrie Cowan and Madeline Krafft from St Vincent de Paul for helping to welcome our Year 5 and 6 Mini Vinnies members, to Father Harry Moore for conducting the blessing and Margaret Fox for preparing gifts for the children.

The Gospel passage for the liturgy was Mark 16: 9-15, which told us to "Go everywhere in the world. Tell the God News to everyone."

What does this mean for us? What is the Good News?

Jesus came to Earth to spread God's message of love and to offer us a new covenant, or agreement, with God. After Jesus died, many of his followers became afraid that they too would be punished for having followed him, however Jesus appeared to many of them and explained how all that had happened needed to happen to fulfil the scriptures. We heard in the Gospel reading that these people ran back to tell the Good News that Jesus was risen from the dead to his Apostles, however they did not believe them. It wasn't until later, when Jesus then also appeared to the Apostles and criticised them for having so little faith, that the Apostles also fully believed. Jesus gave His followers a new mission; to go out and tell the world of God's love and to spread God's love through their actions.

But what about us today? Do we sometimes lose faith when things go wrong in our lives, and when we can see terrible things happening across the world? Sometimes we need to be reminded to have faith in God's saving plan and His love for us. One of the ways our faith can be strengthened is through doing good things for other people. Acts of kindness towards others can restore our faith in both humanity and in God. Today, we commissioned our Mini Vinnies of 2022. We all have a mission to spread the Good News of God's love to the world, however the Mini Vinnies will have a special job to show God's love to those less fortunate through acts of charity and good works. We pray today that the Mini Vinnies will continue to live their new life in Jesus, strengthening their own faith and the faith of those around them through the work they do for others.


