Enhancing the Religious Life of the School

This year we are working to provide authentic, meaningful and engaging liturgy and prayer for our diverse school community.

Our Enhancing Catholic School Identity Team meets once a term to discuss how to ensure the religious life of our school is inclusive and welcoming to people of all faiths and no faith, as well as being true to our Catholic traditions.

Professional development for staff has focussed on our patron saint Mary. Earlier this year, we studied how our Marian tradition can inform our work with the students in our contemporary context. Our aim is to develop a new version of the St Mary's school prayer that includes references to Mary.

Teachers are also engaging with ways to ensure classroom prayer is authentic, meaningful and engaging for the students that they teach.

We acknowledge the work of Mrs Alicia Ninnes as Assistant Principal, Religious Education in this space. Mrs Ninnes works closely with our teachers in developing their Religious education curriculum. Mrs Ninnes is also responsible for facilitating our school liturgies and masses. Already this term, we have celebrated our Easter and Anzac Day liturgies. Still to come are our Mother's day liturgy and whole school mass to celebrate the end of term .

This week our school commemorated ANZAC Day with a liturgy in the undercover area.

The liturgy was led by Miss Anna Bennett and the Year 1 class. Each class also contributed a poppy wreath, to be laid at the prayer table during the liturgy. The liturgy ended with the school choir singing the traditional hymn, *Abide With Me*



FROM THE GUIDANCE COUNSELLOR



In this edition of SchoolTV - SCHOOL REFUSAL

School refusal, sometimes called school avoidance or school phobia, is not uncommon. It is different to 'wagging' or truancy and is often related to worry or anxiety-related issues about going to school. School refusal may start gradually or happen suddenly. Although it is normal for a child to occasionally miss a day of school, parents should only be concerned if a child regularly complains about feeling sick or often asks to stay home due to minor physical complaints.

School refusal is a complex issue as there is rarely a single cause. It affects children of all ages across primary and secondary levels. It can often occur during times of transition at school. More recently, the Coronavirus pandemic has disrupted the educational experience of all students, affecting some more than others. Dealing with a school refusal child can affect the whole family, adding pressure to an already challenging time. School refusal is not considered a formal psychiatric diagnosis. It's a name given to an emotional and/or behavioural problem.

In this edition of SchoolTV, adult carers will learn how best to approach this issue and work towards a solution.

We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this edition of SchoolTV and we always welcome your feedback. If you have any concerns about your child, please contact the school guidance counsellor for further information or seek medical or professional help.
