

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO CLAREMONT SHOWGROUND

Entry by any person into Claremont Showground is subject to these terms and conditions.

1. General

- a. Persons entering Claremont Showground are deemed to have accepted, and understood as binding on them, these conditions and any accompanying risks, obligations and responsibilities. It is your responsibility to read and inform yourself of these conditions.
- b. Unauthorised entry to the Showground may be liable to prosecution.
- c. Persons who are accompanied by minors are responsible for the care, acts or omissions and supervision of those minors at all times.
- d. The Royal Agricultural Society of WA (RASWA) is not liable nor does it accept any responsibility for any loss or damage whatsoever to any person or property or the death or injury suffered to any person or animal whilst at Claremont Showground.
- e. Persons entering Claremont Showground indemnify RASWA against any loss or liability, cost or expense or damages suffered by them, or any person under their control arising from or in relation to the entry either by person, vehicle or otherwise.
- f. RASWA reserves the right to inspect or search bags, baskets or other receptacles brought into or out of Claremont Showground and search all persons, their clothing and other items of such persons.
- g. Persons causing a disturbance or refusing to comply with directions or requests from RASWA will be ejected from Claremont Showground.
- h. RASWA may refuse admission to or eject persons from Claremont Showground at its sole discretion.
- i. Persons entering Claremont Showground must adhere to the Occupational Health & Safety legislation.
- j. Smoking is not permitted within the Showground other than in designated areas.
- k. RASWA conducts surveillance on Claremont Showground. A person entering the Showground maybe photographed, filmed, taped or subjected to monitoring by close circuit television. A person by entering Claremont Showground consents to RASWA or third parties appointed by RASWA photographing, filming or taping them. RASWA or third parties appointed by RASWA can broadcast, publish, license and use any photographs, film, recordings or images without compensation to the subject of the photographs, film, recordings or images. RASWA, third parties and anyone acquiring from them a right to use the material are not liable to any person for its use in any way.
- l. Entry to Claremont Showground does not guarantee automatic entry to all events and activities on at the Showground during the period of entry.
- m. Persons may not without the express authority of RASWA, enter any area where persons are prohibited to enter as indicated by signage, barriers, fences, ropes, doors or otherwise. Persons who do enter such areas may be ejected from Claremont Showground.
- n. Vehicles must not block emergency egress doors or emergency vehicle access roads and are to give way to emergency vehicles.
- o. All accidents or emergencies are to be immediately reported to RASWA:

- p. Persons must obey all signs, notices, directions or requests given by RASWA whilst at Claremont Showground.
- q. Persons must not at any time while at Claremont Showground (without the permission of RASWA):
 - pick or break or uproot any flower, shrub, tree or plant and must not climb on any structure or tree;
 - sell or expose for sale any goods or services;
 - distribute any advertising or promotional material;
 - throw any item;
 - deposit or throw litter other than in an receptacle provided for litter;
 - use offensive or indecent language.
- r. RASWA will not be liable for any loss or damage suffered by any person or caused by any acts or omissions of RASWA or employees, agents or contractors of RASWA, or any other persons present at Claremont Showground.
- s. Persons entering Claremont Showground indemnify RASWA against all liability for or in respect of any claims, demands, actions, suits or proceedings, costs, expenses, loss, damage, injury or death of any person arising out of or in connection with any of your acts or omissions while at Claremont Showground.

2. Photography

- a. Amateur photographers are permitted to take photographs at Claremont Showground, providing that the:
 - the photographer is not causing annoyance or inconvenience to other Showground patrons;
 - the subject of the photo is permitted by law;
 - the subjects have given their consent (if under 18 then their parent's consent); and
 - the photos are not to be sold or used for commercial gain.
- b. Professional photographers must seek prior written approval from RASWA before taking any photographs.

3. Liquor

Persons entering Claremont Showground are advised that:

- alcohol may only be consumed within designated licensed areas;
- intoxicated persons will not be permitted to enter;
- intoxicated persons will be removed from Claremont Showground;
- alcoholic beverages must not be taken into Claremont Showground and are subject to immediate confiscation;
- it is an offence for minors to purchase or consume alcohol;
- it is an offence to sell to or supply minors with alcohol;



4. Restricted and Prohibited Items

The following restricted or prohibited items are not permitted into Claremont Showground and are subject to immediate confiscation:

- Glass or breakable containers;
- Cans or metal containers;
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Illicit drugs;
- Flares or fireworks;
- Adhesive stickers;
- Any whistle, loud hailer, public address system or other electronic or broadcast device;
- Laser pointers or any object which might be used to distract, hinder or interfere with the conduct of any event or any animal or person taking part in an event;
- Prohibited weapons;
- Knives or other dangerous weapons including potential missiles;
- Skateboards, scooters, roller blades or bicycles;
- Large items that cannot fit under seats including eskies and bags;
- Animals unless approved by RASWA;
- Any item that person intends or another person intends to distribute, hawk, sell, offer or expose for sale or distribution;
- Any object, device or substance that may be used to deface or damage any part of Claremont Showground, such as any spray paint or permanent markers;
- Balloons;
- Other items as determined by RASWA management that may cause injury or public nuisance.

5. Security and Safety

- The safety and security of patrons and staff is of the highest priority at the IGA Perth Royal Show.
- The Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia (RASWA) implements a number of security procedures and safety measures during the Show including, but not limited to, onsite security personnel, WA Police presence and the use of comprehensive high-definition CCTV monitoring to provide comfort and reassurance for patrons. Additional security procedures have been introduced for this year's IGA Perth Royal Show including, increased security patrols, vehicle checks, additional security presence at each gate and increased bag checks.
- In addition, new Traffic Management Procedures have been put in place with internal traffic barriers in high pedestrian areas and increased vehicle compliance standards with wheel clamping and towing off site if not adhered to.
- These practices are planned in consultation with and on advice from the appropriate authorities in respect to security requirements to ensure best practice in line with major events and venues.
