It is with great pleasure we announce the introduction of the combined Schools Competitions, which we invite your school and students to participate in.

There are currently six (6) competitions to get involved in:

- Cat Art
- Garden Produce
- Cookery
- Poultry Art
- Creative Crafts
- Sustainable Scarecrow

The aim of these competitions is to involve the children in aspects of horticulture, sustainability and agriculture, as well as encourage their interest through researching and learning about these fields.

We would like to create an interest in the next generation about agriculture and the significant role it plays in the world.

Each competition will be judged, and certificates and rosettes will be awarded to First, Second and Third places. Up to two Highly Commended awards may also be awarded.

Points will be awarded to the School for each winning exhibit in the Schools Competitions. These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions **Perpetual Trophy**, which can be displayed on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

Judging will take place prior to the Show and the exhibits will be displayed* for the duration of the Show and have the potential to be viewed by 400,000 Show patrons.

CAT ARTWORK COMPETITION

It is with great pleasure we invite your school to compete at the 2019 Perth Royal Show in the Cat Artwork Competition.

The aim of the Cat Artwork Competition is to invite students to research information on cats, whether pedigree, domesticated or wild.

We would like to create an interest in the next generation about how to care for domestic animals, how useful or important they can be for a family and allow them to express their ideas through a creative work.

The competition will be judged before Show.

A rosette and a certificate will be awarded to First, Second and Third places in each year group.

Two Highly Commended awards may also be awarded.

Results will be announced and awards distributed after the conclusion of the Show.

Points will be awarded to the School for each winning exhibit in the Schools Competitions: three (3) points for First place, two (2) points for Second place and one (1) point for Third place. These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions Perpetual Trophy, which they can display on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

In the event of a tie, the School gaining the highest number of First places will be judged the winner. Should a tie still exist, the School gaining the highest number of Second places will be judged the winner. If a tie still exists an equal award may be made.

THE COMPETITION IS

- Open to students in K to Year 10.
- Judged in age groups (K/PP, Y1/Y2, Y3/Y4, Y5/Y6 and Y7/Y8, Y9/Y10).
- Free.
- Restricted to one entry per student.

COMPETITION RULES

1. An original piece by the student.
 2. Artwork to be submitted on the frame attached for display at the Show (A3). Paintings or drawings of cats utilizing different techniques, technologies and mediums. All smudgeable material must be adequately fixed with fixing spray.
 3. Exhibits must be **delivered to** the Royal Agricultural Society of WA **by Friday 30 August 2019**.
 4. Exhibits must be **collected from** the Royal Agricultural Society of WA **by Friday 29 November 2019**.
Uncollected artworks will be disposed of. Please call 6263 3157, Cat Artwork Competition and Event Coordinator to arrange collection.
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The Students artworks will be displayed in the Cat Pavilion for the duration of the Perth Royal Show and has the possibility to be viewed by 400,000 Show attendees.

COOKERY COMPETITION

It is with great pleasure we invite your school and students to compete at the 2019 Perth Royal Show in the Schools Cookery Competition.

The aim of the Schools Cookery Competition is to encourage the children's interest and involve them in baking from scratch.

We would like to create an interest in the next generation about where their food comes from and how it is made.

The competition will be judged, and certificates and rosettes will be awarded to First, Second and Third places. Up to two Highly Commended awards may also be awarded.

Points will be awarded to the School for each winning exhibit in the Schools Competitions: three (3) points for First place, two (2) points for Second place and one (1) point for Third place. These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions Perpetual Trophy, which they can display on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

In the event of a tie, the School gaining the highest number of First places will be judged the winner. Should a tie still exist, the School gaining the highest number of Second places will be judged the winner. If a tie still exists an equal award may be made.

THE COMPETITION IS

- Open to Primary and Secondary Schools within Western Australia.
- Free to enter.
- Restricted to one (1) entry per student. The entry must be entirely the work of the individual student.
- Conducted in accordance with the Cookery rules, regulations and section conditions, which can be located in the Creative Crafts & Cookery schedule.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Each student is required to provide one of the below:

a. PRIMARY STUDENTS

Biscuits

Six (6). One (1) variety. May be iced.

b. SECONDARY STUDENTS

Slice – Sweet

Six (6) pieces. One (1) variety. May be iced.

2. Exhibits must be **delivered on Wednesday 25 September 2019** between 7.45am and 10.30am. Delivery location to be advised. Exhibits will **ONLY** be accepted on this date and between these times.
 3. **Each entry must be the students' own work.**
 4. The Society's exhibit number will be sent to the school prior to the Show.
 5. The Society will provide plates for exhibits on arrival at the Showground.
 6. It is the delivery person's responsibility to ensure the exhibit number is securely placed on the plate prior to handing the exhibit over to the Stewards.
 7. All exhibits become the property of RASWA once delivered, and will be disposed of after the conclusion of the Show for health and safety reasons.
 8. Any exhibit which becomes mouldy or unsuitable for display may be removed.
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Judging will take place on Wednesday 25 September 2019. The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into. Results will be announced and awards distributed after the conclusion of the Show.

The exhibits will be displayed for the duration of the Show and has the potential to be viewed by 400,000 Show patrons.

CREATIVE CRAFTS COMPETITION

The aim of the Schools Creative Crafts Competition is to encourage the children's interest and involve them in creativity and appreciating the value and skills of handmade goods.

We would like to create an interest in the next generation about using their creativity as and in how goods are made.

The competition will be judged, and certificates and rosettes will be awarded to First, Second and Third places. Up to two Highly Commended awards may also be awarded.

Points will be awarded to the School for each winning exhibit in the Schools Competitions: three (3) points for First place, two (2) points for Second place and one (1) point for Third place. These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions Perpetual Trophy, which they can display on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

In the event of a tie, the School gaining the highest number of First places will be judged the winner. Should a tie still exist, the School gaining the highest number of Second places will be judged the winner. If a tie still exists an equal award may be made.

THE COMPETITION IS

- Open to Secondary Schools within Western Australia.
- Free to enter.
- Restricted to one (1) entry per student.
- Conducted in accordance with the Creative Crafts rules, regulations and section conditions, which can be located in the Creative Crafts & Cookery schedule.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Each student is required to provide one of the below:

SECONDARY STUDENTS

Cushion Cover – Embellishments allowed. No larger than 40cm square. May include various craft techniques.

2. Exhibits must be **delivered on either Tuesday 10 September 2019** between 7.00am and 4.00pm or **Wednesday 11 September 2019** between 8.00am and 6.00pm. Delivery location to be advised. Exhibits will ONLY be accepted on this date and between these times.
3. **Each entry must be the students' own work.**
4. The Society's exhibit number will be sent to the school prior to the Show.
5. It is the delivery person's responsibility to ensure the exhibit number is securely placed on the plate prior to handing the exhibit over to the Stewards.
6. **POSTAL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE A RETURN SELF ADDRESSED PAID BAG, ALLOWING ENTRIES TO BE RETURNED AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE SHOW.**
7. Collection of Exhibits Goods will be available for **Collection on Sunday 6 October 2019** between 11.00am and 1.00pm or **Monday 7 October 2019** between 7.00am and 6.00pm.
8. Exhibitors who desire their exhibit returned by post, courier or air, must advise the Society in writing and pre-pay the cost.
9. All exhibits must be collected within seven (7) days from the conclusion of the Show, unless pre-arranged with the Competition and Event Coordinator.

Judging will take place on Friday 20 September 2019. The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into. Results will be announced and awards distributed after the conclusion of the Show.

The exhibits will be displayed for the duration of the Show and has the potential to be viewed by 400,000 Show patrons.

GARDEN PRODUCE COMPETITION

Points will be awarded to the School for each winning exhibit in the Schools Competitions: three (3) points for First place, two (2) points for Second place and one (1) point for Third place. These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions Perpetual Trophy, which they can display on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

In the event of a tie, the School gaining the highest number of First places will be judged the winner. Should a tie still exist, the School gaining the highest number of Second places will be judged the winner. If a tie still exists an equal award may be made.

THE COMPETITION IS

- Only open to Primary Schools within Western Australia.
- Free to enter.
- Restricted to one (1) entry per school.

COMPETITION RULES

1. Each school is required to provide one (1) standard wheelbarrow of potted produce, which must be movable. Each plant must be contained and growing in individual pots within the wheelbarrow.
 2. Produce must be **delivered on Thursday 26 September 2019** between 8am and 5pm. Delivery location to be advised.
 3. Exhibits must be **collected on Monday 7 October 2019** between 9am and 1pm, unless pre-arranged with the Competition and Event Coordinator. Uncollected exhibits will be disposed of.
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Judging will take place on Friday 27 September 2019. The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into. Results will be announced and awards distributed after the conclusion of the Show.

The wheelbarrow will be displayed for the duration of the Show and has the potential to be viewed by 400,000 Show patrons.

These points will be totalled, and the highest scoring school will be awarded the Perth Royal Show Schools Competitions Perpetual Trophy, which they can display on the School grounds for three (3) school terms. A replica will also be awarded for the school to keep.

In the event of a tie, the School gaining the highest number of First places will be judged the winner. Should a tie still exist, the School gaining the highest number of Second places will be judged the winner. If a tie still exists an equal award may be made.

 5. Exhibits must be **collected on Monday 7 October 2019** between 9am and 1pm, unless pre-arranged with the Competition and Event Coordinator. Uncollected exhibits will be disposed of.
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Judging will take place on Friday 27 September 2019. The judges' decision is final, and no correspondence shall be entered into. Results will be announced and awards distributed after the conclusion of the Show.

The scarecrow will be displayed for the duration of the Show and has the potential to be viewed by 400,000 Show patrons.
