Discarded face masks a threat to wildlife:

From the start COVID to the end of 2020, it is estimated that more than 1.5 billion disposable face masks ended up in the world's oceans. Single-use masks are typically made from plastics which take up to 450 years to break down, and in the process they shed countless microplastic fibres, which enter into the food chain.



Let's do our bit to prevent harm:

- Dispose of single use face masks correctly in the bin
- Use a pair of scissors to snip the straps before disposing of them
- Whenever possible, use a reusable cloth face masks instead of a single-use face mask

If you see a bird or other animal which is entangled, call your local wildlife rescue authority immediately.
