In a recent article, the Commonwealth honours awards showed some anomalies, For example:

- Only 31% of Order of Australia Member awards are granted to women
- The 5 top post codes of recipients: Sydney CBD, Mosman, Toorak, Canberra, Melbourne CBD
- There are approximately 130 directors of boards of ASX 300 companies who have an OA
- There are at least 320 politicians who have an OA, including 165 coalition: 130 Labor
- 130 people (at least) people who have been deemed to be unfit to retain honours since 1975
- Since 1975, when the awards were first introduced, 512 people have declined receiving an award.


