60 Trees for 60 Years:



On Friday, 23rd October the Rotary Club of Corrimal undertook a small tree and shrub planting project at Cawley Park, Russell Vale. As part of our 60th year celebrations we decided to help the planet by planting trees, shrubs, or groundcovers. 8 members of the club and 2 council employees enjoyed planting 3 cabbage tree palms and about 145 native shrubs & grasses. We settled the plants with a good water and some mulch. The plants will take CO2 out of the air, breaking it down into carbon which is stored or used by micro-organisms in the ground, and oxygen, which is dispersed back into the atmosphere to allow us humans to breathe.
