Do You Know?

In Australia All Over on Sunday morning, a maritime pilot told of 1700 gift boxes that had been organised and filled by various organisations, including Mission to Seafarers. They were being distributed on Sunday to seafarers in Sydney port.

He said, " they have been having a hard time....so many haven't been able to leave their ships for 14 – 15 months, due to Covid. Homesick, missing their families it is very hard. They are doing it tough."

How often have we heard that phrase this year? He reminded the listeners that everything we buy-everything - is brought here by the seafarers. Then John Kewa told me that this year they expect 3 -5 ships to be in port and seafarers will be given ice cream in boxes and a foot long Subway on Christmas Day. They can't do the usual barbecue because of Covid.
