



TTA Hall of Fame (Veterans) Induction – Kay Crowell



The TTA Hall of Fame recognises outstanding contributions made to table tennis in the fields of playing, coaching, officiating and/or administering the sport. A person may only be inducted to the TTA Hall of Fame by meeting the criteria listed in the [TTA Hall of Fame Regulations](#).

TTA is pleased to announce that Kay Crowell has been inducted into the TTA Hall of Fame (Veterans) as of 19 October 2019. Kay is an icon of Veterans table tennis and has been an outstanding contributor to table tennis in Australia.

Kay's notable achievements include, but are not limited to:

- Winning 1 bronze medal at the World Veterans Championships.
- Winning the Over 40 Women's Singles title in eight consecutive years at the National Veterans Championships. This is the longest ever winning streak for any competitor in any age group in any individual event, in the history of the competition.
- In the first 6 of the 8 years that Kay won the Over 40 Women's Singles title, she was also undefeated in the Over 40 Women's Team Event, meaning she did not lose any singles matches at the National Veterans Championships for 6 years in a row.
- Winning 17 National Titles in individual events in total. In addition to winning the Over 40 Women's Singles title on 8 occasions, Kay also won the Over 40 Women's Doubles on 6 occasions and the Over 40 Mixed Doubles on 3 occasions.
- Kay's conduct, characterised by demonstrating good sportsmanship, acting within the spirit of the game, attitude and behaviour, being a positive role model, etiquette and adherence to the laws of the game is a positive example for others to follow.
