State / Territory Government Voucher Programs

New South Wales

The NSW government offers the Active Kids program provides two \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year.

The voucher can be used for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and recreational activities during the calendar year it was issued. To register as an Active Kids provider and begin accepting Active Kids vouchers, first check if you're eligible.

Voucher 1 is valid January to December and Voucher 2 is valid July to December.

Queensland

FairPlay vouchers replace the Get Started Vouchers program. Parents, carers or guardians can apply for a voucher valued up to \$150 for their child, which can be used towards membership, registration or participation fees with registered activity providers. There is a limit of 1 voucher per child per calendar year.

12 May 2021: Vouchers expire and must have been presented to an activity provider.

Victoria

Get Active Victoria vouchers are new in 2021. You can be reimbursed up to \$200 for costs related to:

- membership, registration or general fees to participate at an affiliated sport or active recreation club, association or program
- equipment required to participate in the nominated activity, including second-hand equipment
- uniforms and clothing required to participate in the nominated activity, including second-hand uniforms

You must pay for the membership, registration fees, equipment or uniform first. You will then be reimbursed for part or all of the cost up to the value of \$200.

Vouchers can be applied for from 31 May using the invoice from PlayHQ when you register for Auskick

Western Australia

KidSport enables eligible Western Australian children aged 5 to 18 years to participate in community sport by offering them financial assistance of up to \$150 per calendar year towards club fees. KidSport applications are assessed by the local government in which the child resides or by the KidSport team at the department.

South Australia

The Sports Vouchers program is a government of South Australia initiative administered by the Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing. The program provides an opportunity for primary school-aged children from Reception to Year 7 at a South Australian School to receive up to a \$100 discount on sports or dance membership/registration fees. The purpose is to increase the number of children playing organised sport or participating in dance activities by reducing cost as a barrier.

Northern Territory

The Sport Voucher Scheme is available to every school-enrolled child from preschool to year 12 and home-schooled children. Children living in an urban area are eligible to receive two \$100 sport vouchers each year. One in January and one in July, for sport, recreation, and cultural activities. Parents or carers need to apply for vouchers online each semester. All vouchers expire on 31 May each year.
