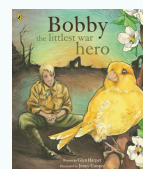

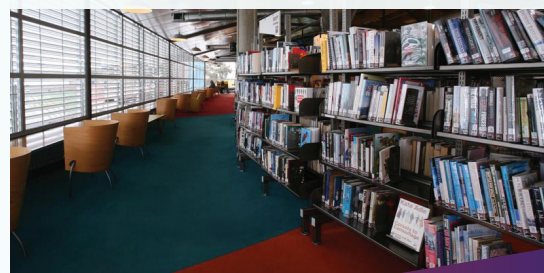


3-10 NOVEMBER
