In 2017 Suttons proudly partnered with The Fred Hollows Foundation to help end avoidable blindness in our own backyard in Western NSW.

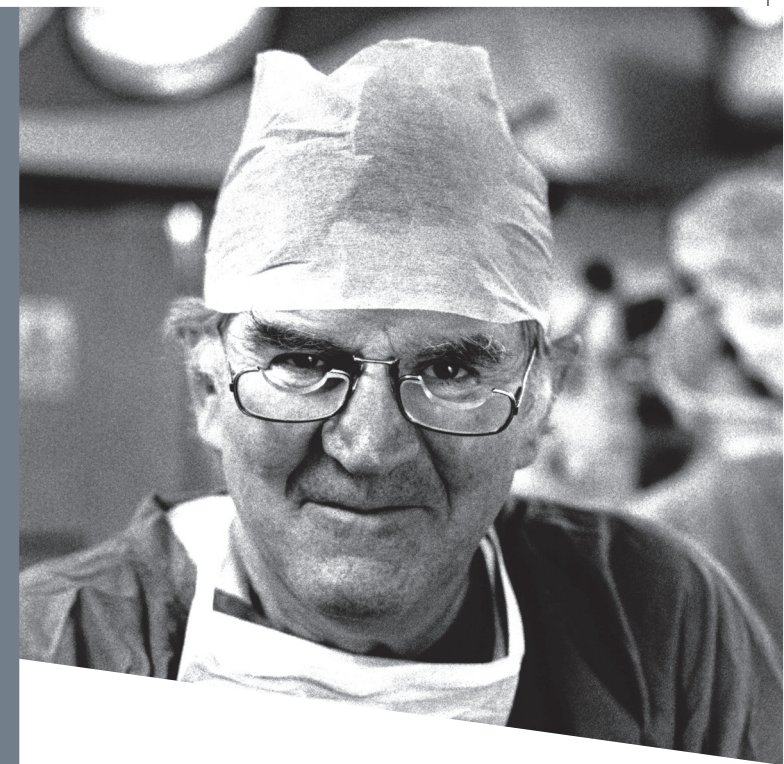
'See Better in September' is just one of our initiatives where Suttons are 'driving Fred Hollows' to improve the health of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as well as non-indigenous Australians living in remote NSW.

By supporting the Outback Eye Service, Suttons is helping The Fred Hollows Foundation to:

- Screen 1,200 people
- Perform 100 cataract surgeries
- Perform 100 diabetic retinopathy treatments
- Distribute 400 spectacles
- Support the employment of an Ophthalmic Nurse and an Orthoptist
- Train 1 ophthalmologist

DID YOU KNOW?

Four eye conditions—refractive error, cataract, diabetic retinopathy and trachoma cause 90% of vision loss among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Each of these conditions are preventable or treatable and most vision loss can be corrected overnight.



ABOUT FRED

Professor Fred Hollows had a dream. This was to see a world where no person was needlessly blind and Indigenous Australians exercised their right to good health.

As an ophthalmologist, humanitarian and social activist, Fred was shocked at the poor standards of eye health in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities in Australia. This drove his desire to fight for better access to eye health and living conditions for Indigenous Australians.

Fred and Gabi Hollows founded The Fred Hollows Foundation in 1992 just months before he passed away. The Foundation continues the work he started here in Australia, and around the world, restoring sight and transforming lives.
