Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, an Order is hereby made whereby **GLC Fresh Foods Limited** is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol for a period of three months from **23 June 2025** on or from the premises known as **New World Lincoln**, subject to the duties, liabilities and obligations under the current licence no. 59/OFF/166/2023 continuing in force for the duration of the Order.

This Temporary Authority Order shall expire on the 23 September 2025.

OFF LICENCE

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

ARLA Ref: 59/OFF/166/2023

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), <u>LINCOLN SUPERMARKET LIMITED</u> (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **77 Gerald Street**, <u>Lincoln</u> and known as "NEW WORLD LINCOLN", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply complimentary samples of alcohol on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with

Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS - SECTION 116 (2)

(a) No alcohol is to be sold, supplied or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.

(b) Alcohol may only be sold, supplied or delivered on the following days and during the following hours while the premises are operating as a supermarket with off licence sales:

Monday to Sunday from 7.00am to 9.00pm

(c) Water shall be freely available to customer while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises.

d) Single Area Condition: Alcohol Area for display and promotion of alcohol:

- Only the area described and delineated on the plan approved by the District Licensing Committee is the permitted are for the display and promotion of alcohol within the premises as required under sections 112 and 113. The effect of single-area conditions is described in s.114.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

f) The following step must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:

• The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their Host Responsibility Policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.

(g) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:

Alcohol must be only sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.

(h) No sales to young erson in school uniforms regardless of their ability to produce identification.

Conditions applying to any/all remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol:

(i) The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site;

The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires

A legible image of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.

(ii) The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age;

In case of an order made using an internet site – the prospective buyer must declare by ticking an on-screen box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over);

- once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and

- again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.

• In the case of a telephone order, the prospective buyer is asked to declare orally that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over);

- once when the conversation concerned begins; and

- again, immediately before the conversation is completed.

(iii) In the case of any internet form or telephone order, unless the prospective buyer has by declaring, or by ticking, or by signing the relevant age declarations that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where any prospective receiver is involved, has declared, ticked or signed that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over), the procedure is to refuse to sell alcohol to that prospective buyer.

(i) The Supermarket shall be Undesignated

OTHER RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

Section 56 - Display of signs

Section 58 - Restriction on kinds of alcohol sold in supermarkets and premises directly accessible from supermarkets - beer, wine and cider

Section 59 – Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off-licences

Section 214 - Manager to be on duty at all time and responsible for compliance

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises situated at 77 Gerald Street, Lincoln are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Selwyn District Licensing Committee.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from main carpark accessed from Vernon Drive, Lincoln is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force
(a) either -

(i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or

(ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but

(b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –

(i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or

(ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

Subject to the requirements above, the licence expires on the 1st day of October 2025, unless again renewed.

NOTE: This licence replaces the licence number 59/OFF/065/2019 issued by the Selwyn District Licensing Committee.
