

Off-Licence

(premises that are not a conveyance)

Sections 17 to 20, and 64 Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Form 10, Lic8 grocery

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Parry Acklin Limited** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **244 Palmerston Street, Westport** and known as New World Westport to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample, for consumption on the premises. The licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

If this licence is not endorsed under section 40 of the Act, the licensee is also authorised to sell alcohol on or from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

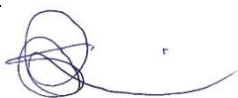
This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day.
- b) No alcohol may be sold other than— (i) beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or (ii) mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or (iii) fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine; or (iv) grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine; or (v) a food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
- c) Alcohol may be sold or delivered only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 7:45am till 8:45pm
- d) Drinking water must be freely available for patrons where complimentary samples are being offered.
- e) A Host Responsibility Policy must be maintained and displayed and all staff must receive training on responsibilities and obligations under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- f) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.
- g) The following parts of the premises are designated as:
Undesignated: Entire Premises (excluding bakery, butchery, upstairs office and loading areas).
- h) Sections 56-57 of the Act requires the licence holder to display the following at each principal entrance to the premises so as to be easily read by persons immediately outside the entrance: (i) Signage stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; and (ii) A copy of the licence including conditions.
- i) The only area delineated on the attached plan is a permitted area for the display and promotion of alcohol and must be displayed.
- j) Section 214(3) of the Act requires signage to be displayed inside the premises which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.

Duration

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- (a) either—
 - (i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
 - (i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - (ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
